This week in the Robins we have been busy exploring the celebration of Christmas and the Christmas story. In our Topic lesson, we explored the key question - "Are the presents we get for Christmas the same as our grandparents would have had?" We looked at old and new toys and explored how they have changed over time. We even had a go at playing some old-fashioned games, they were so much fun!





This week we have started our new, end of the day class reader novel 'Mr Penguin and The Lost Treasure'. The children have been engrossed in the story so far and we are only 5 chapters in. We can't wait to see what happens next week!





This week Woodies took part in their first sustainability lesson. Our focus was food waste and the class designed posters to encourage others to limit their food waste by offering suggestions to tackle this issue. Super ideas Woodies!





We have been looking at our local Artist, John Harris. We studied some of his watercolour paintings and chose our favourite elements. We then used watercolour pallets to replicate these elements.
