Dear Parents and families,

Farewell and Thank You, Reverend Jenny!

It is with mixed emotions that we announce the retirement of Reverend Jenny from her role as Rector of Watton, as of June 1st.

Reverend Jenny has been an invaluable part of our community for the past 13 years, and her presence will be greatly missed. She has helped us celebrate countless Harvest Festivals and Year 6 Leavers Services, creating memorable moments for our children and their families. Before the pandemic, she also regularly visited the school to lead whole-school assemblies.

Beyond her pastoral duties, Reverend Jenny also dedicated many years of service as a school governor, providing invaluable guidance and support to our school's development.

As of now, a new rector has not yet been appointed to replace Reverend Jenny. We will keep you informed of any updates regarding this.

On behalf of the entire school community - children, staff, and parents - we extend our heartfelt thanks to Reverend Jenny for her unwavering dedication to both the Watton community and our school. We wish her all the very best for a long, happy, and fulfilling retirement!

Term Time Holiday Absences

We believe that consistent attendance is vital for every child's learning and development. We want to take this opportunity to remind you of the importance of your child being in school every day and to update you on the government's rules regarding term-time holidays.

New Government Rules on Term-Time Holidays

The government's position on term-time holidays is very clear: schools are not permitted to authorise any absence for holidays during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Parents do not have an automatic right to take their child out of school for a holiday during term time.

- **Exceptional Circumstances:** Written request for absence must be for truly 'exceptional circumstances' - unforeseen, unavoidable, or significant events that cannot be scheduled outside of term time. Holidays, regardless of cost or timing, are *not* considered exceptional. Furthermore, any decision regarding 'exceptional circumstances' rests solely at the Headteacher's discretion and a written letter does not guarantee automatic authorisation of your child's absence.
- **Penalty Notices (Fines):** Unauthorised absences for holidays will lead to a Penalty Notice (fine) from the local authority. These fines are typically £60 per parent per child if paid within 21 days, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. It's important to note that each day of unauthorised absence equates to two unauthorised sessions (one for the morning registration and one for the afternoon registration). Once a child accumulates 10 or more unauthorised absences (5 full days) within a 10-week period, the local authority will be alerted, and a penalty notice may be issued. Non-payment may lead to prosecution.

We understand that family holidays are important, and we strongly encourage you to plan these during the designated school holiday periods. It's worth noting that school staff are also expected to be in school every day during term time and are not able to take advantage of cheaper holiday rates outside of official school breaks.
