We hope all the dads and special male figures in our children's lives enjoyed their Father's Day gifts last Sunday! It was wonderful to see the excitement on the children's faces as they carefully chose and paid for their presents.

A huge thank you goes out to our incredible FOW and all the parent volunteers who came into school last Friday to help run the Father's Day stalls. Their time and effort made it a truly special experience for the children, giving them the valuable chance to choose and pay for their own gifts, just as they do for Mother's Day. Their support is truly invaluable!

Here's a snapshot of some of the exciting events that have taken place across the school this week:

Year 6's PGL Adventure: Our Year 6 pupils embarked on their much-anticipated PGL trip this Monday! From the fantastic photos we've seen, it looks like they've had an absolutely brilliant time challenging themselves with new activities, building teamwork skills, and making lasting memories. We're so proud of their enthusiasm and resilience throughout the week. A huge thank you to Mrs Roberts, Mrs Shortland and Miss Roberts who accompanied them and made this invaluable experience possible.

Year 5's Outdoor Science at Watkins Farm: Building on their recent experience of making spaghetti bolognese in school, Year 5 were able to see first hand where two of their key ingredients, wheat and beef, truly originate. They learned about the complete lifecycle of wheat, from seed to the flour that eventually becomes pasta, and understood the dedicated care involved in raising cattle for beef. It was a truly insightful experience, allowing them to appreciate the effort and resources that go into producing the food we enjoy.

One of the most memorable parts of the morning, I'm told, was the chance to try on special glasses designed to simulate how cows see the world! This unique activity provided a fantastic moment of empathy and a deeper understanding of animal perception, sparking lots of curiosity and discussion.

Year 3's Rainforest Workshop with Hertfordshire Zoo: Year 3 had an exciting visit from Hertfordshire Zoo on Monday to learn more about their geography topic: Rainforests. The children all got to hold and identify 3D printed skulls of various animals that live in the rainforest and learnt interesting facts about each animal. The children then learnt more about the 4 layers of rainforest and matched each animal to its habitat.

'No Pens Day' & Forest School Fun: This Tuesday and Wednesday saw the return of our popular 'No Pens Day' for the whole school, where children were encouraged to learn through creative and practical activities without relying on traditional writing. It's a wonderful opportunity for them to develop different skills and express themselves in alternative ways. Alongside this, our termly Forest School visits continued for all year groups on Tuesday or Wednesday, allowing children to connect with nature, build confidence, and develop problem-solving skills in our wonderful outdoor environment.

Coming up Next Week - Watton's Got Talent

Is back again this year due to popular demand!!!

This event is open to all children in KS2 to take part in. They will audition in their class next week and all of the children in each class will vote for their favourite act. The top three acts in each class will go through to the final of our talent show, which will be held in the hall on Friday 27th June. Internet Safety - Apps

Apps for Primary Age Children

For primary school-aged children, the internet can be a fantastic resource for learning and entertainment, provided it's used with appropriate supervision and on age-suitable platforms. Here are some examples of apps that can be beneficial:

- **Educational Apps:** Many apps are designed to support learning in subjects like maths and literacy. Examples include Duolingo ABC, Khan Academy Kids, Teach Your Monster to Read, DoodleMaths, and Times Tables Rock Stars. These often use gamification to make learning engaging and fun.
- **Creative and Interactive Apps:** Apps that encourage creativity and problem-solving are excellent. Think ScratchJr for coding, or apps that allow children to create stories, art, or music.
- **Curated Content Platforms:** For video content, YouTube Kids and BBC iPlayer Kids offer age-appropriate and filtered content, significantly reducing the risk of exposure to unsuitable material found on the main YouTube platform. Similarly, Spotify Kids provides a curated music experience.
- **Family-Friendly Messaging Apps:** If you're considering a messaging app, look for those designed specifically for children, like Kinzoo Messenger or Zigazoo. These often have stricter privacy settings and parental controls, limiting interaction to known contacts.

Apps to Avoid for Primary Age Children

Many popular apps, particularly social media and general messaging platforms, are not suitable for primary school children, even if your child insists "everyone else is using it." This is because these platforms are designed for older users and pose significant risks:

- **Social Media Platforms** (e.g., TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat, Facebook, Twitter/X, Discord, WhatsApp): The vast majority of these platforms have a minimum age requirement of 13 years old or higher (WhatsApp is 16). This isn't just an arbitrary number; it's due to:
 - **Exposure to Inappropriate Content:** These platforms are unregulated and can expose children to adult content, hate speech, bullying, violence, and harmful trends.
 - **Online Predators:** The open nature of these platforms makes it easier for children to be contacted by strangers, posing a significant risk of grooming and exploitation.
 - **Privacy Concerns:** Children may unknowingly share personal information that could put them at risk. Their data can also be collected and used in ways they don't understand.
 - **Cyberbullying:** Social media can be a breeding ground for cyberbullying, which can have a severe impact on a child's mental health and well-being.
 - **Addiction and Mental Health:** Algorithms are designed to maximise engagement, which can be highly addictive for developing brains and contribute to anxiety, body image issues, and low self-esteem.
- **Anonymous Chatting Apps** (e.g., Yik Yak, Whisper, Kik): These apps allow users to communicate anonymously, making it incredibly difficult to monitor interactions and increasing the risk of exposure to harmful content, cyberbullying, and contact from predators.
- **Live Streaming Apps** (e.g., Bigo Live): These platforms often have no age verification and can expose children to inappropriate live content, and users may be prompted to share personal information like their age and location.
- **Games with Open Chat Features:** While many games are perfectly safe, those with unmoderated public chat functions (like some popular multiplayer games) can expose children to inappropriate language and interactions with strangers.
