Dear Parents and families,

This Wednesday, we had our whole school Creative Arts Day. The inspiration for the day was a single, captivating image of an imaginary creature known as a Griffie (see the image below). Using this as a springboard, the teachers designed a bespoke curriculum for the day that spanned the entire creative spectrum (art, creative writing, drama, dance, music, design and food technology).

It was wonderful to see the Griffie come to life in so many different ways: Here is selected highlight from the day in each class. Take a look at the photos too on p4.

**Pre school:** Sponge painting a huge Griffie as he had lost his colours!

**Nursery:** Arriving in school to find a huge Griffie egg and making Griffie cakes. Yum!

**Reception:** Using a photo as a prompt, the children used their phonics to describe the Griffie.

**Year 1:** Using water colours to paint huge individual Griffie eye!

**Year 2:** Using collage to carefully layer different shades of green and orange paper to create a textured, multi-colored Griffie!

**Year 3:** Unlock clues to the Griffie's cookie recipe and once successful, they were able to make their own Griffie cookies!

**Year 4:** Learnt and performed a blues song called 'The Griffie Blues'.

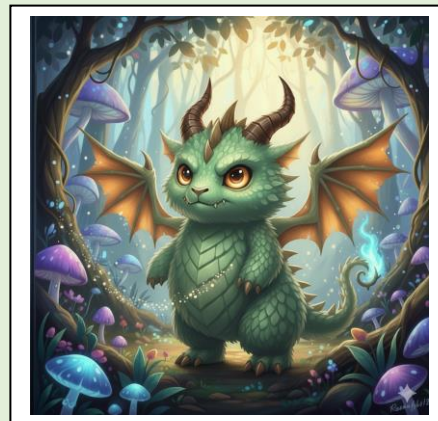
**Year 5:** Creative writing and created an art piece on the back ground setting of the picture.

**Year 6:** Wrote an encounter between the Griffie and a character from The Spiderwick Chronicle.

On Thursday morning, we held a whole school sharing assembly. Groups of children from every year group showcased their hard work.

We want to ensure that you too have a chance to see some of the children's creative work. During the Parents' Evenings next month, each teacher will be setting up a table Top Display in the hall.

This will be a unique opportunity for you to see the "progression of skill" across the school. By seeing how the Early Years classes interpreted the Griffie compared to the other year groups, you will get a clear window into how we nurture and develop creativity as our children grow.



I truly hope your children have come home this week full of stories about their adventures with the Griffie.

### Coming Up Next week

We are delighted to inform you that next Wednesday, we will be hosting professional Rugby Taster Sessions for all children across both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 during the morning (Years 1 - 6)

## Creating Healthy Digital Habits

While technology is a brilliant tool for learning and creativity, finding the "sweet spot" at home can be challenging. Striking a healthy balance is less about a strict minute-by-minute countdown and more about the quality of the engagement.

### **Tips for a Healthy Digital Diet**

- **The "Golden Hour":** We strongly recommend a screen-free hour before bedtime. Blue light can significantly disrupt the sleep patterns children need for a productive day of learning.
- **Device-Free Zones:** Consider making mealtimes "tech-free." These are vital windows for conversation and developing social cues.
- **Age-Appropriate Content:** Regularly check that the games and apps your child uses align with their age group. Peer pressure can often lead children toward content designed for much older audiences.

We aren't suggesting a total 'digital detox,' but rather encouraging a healthy balance where children and parents control their devices, instead of their devices controlling them. Thank you for your continued support in helping our children stay balanced, rested, and ready to learn.

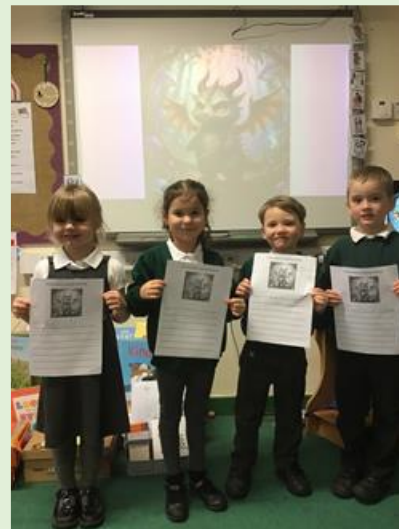
## Great to Be Gold
