Dear Parents and families,

Although very belated, I would like to take this opportunity, on behalf of all of the staff at Watton, to wish you a Happy New Year and, although a distant memory, we hope you had a lovely Christmas, managed to relax and had a lovely time with friends and family. It is hard to believe that we are a third of the way through the academic year but I have to say your children are nothing but a credit to you and to us. We look forward to another brilliant term and sharing our successes, events and news with you over the coming weeks.

As we have already seen with the snowfall this week, winter weather is officially upon us. I wanted to take this opportunity to share our contingency plans for extreme weather and snow. Our primary goal is always to keep the school open and maintain a normal routine for our children. However, the safety of our children, parents, and staff is our top priority.

We will make every effort to remain open. A decision to close the school is only made if the site is deemed unsafe or if staff-to-pupil ratios cannot be met due to travel disruptions.

In the event of a closure or later start to the school day, we will notify you as early as possible via our usual communication channels.

Remote Learning Plan

If school has to be closed, learning will continue at home. We are committed to providing a structured day to keep the children engaged. Teachers will provide:

- * Live Zoom Sessions: These will take place throughout the day to introduce new topics and stay connected with the class.
- * Follow-up Activities: Tasks will be set for children to complete independently following each live session.
- * Regular Updates: Zoom login times and details will be sent directly to you via Marvellous Me by the class teachers.

How You Can Prepare

To ensure a smooth transition to remote learning, please ensure you have access to your Marvellous Me account. We also recommend checking that you have set up a free Zoom account on your home device.

We appreciate your continued support and cooperation in keeping our school community safe and learning, whatever the weather may bring.

Considerate Parking

As we move into the new term, I would like to share a reminder regarding parking near the school. Our primary concern is the safety of our children, and we need the support of our entire parent community to ensure the beginning and end of the school day run smoothly and safely.

To help us achieve this, please take a moment to review our parking guidelines:

The Children's Centre Car Park: Space is at a premium, so please ensure you park strictly between the marked bays. This simple courtesy ensures that we can accommodate as many vehicles as possible and prevents unnecessary congestion.

Rectory Lane: We kindly ask that you avoid parking along Rectory Lane, especially as you approach the school gates.

Keep Pavements Clear: Please do not mount the kerb. Pavements must remain unobstructed for families walking with small children and pushchairs.

Respect the Zig-Zags: Never park or drop off opposite the yellow zig-zag lines. These zones are designed to provide a clear line of sight for children crossing the road.

Please be aware that we have been informed to expect further spot checks from our local PCSOs this term. They will be monitoring the area to ensure all road users are following safety regulations and parking legally. A huge thank you to the many parents and carers who already park considerately and safely. Your patience and care truly make a difference in keeping our pupils out of harm's way.
