- ⇒ To increase attendance of all pupils across school

Why is it important to be in school every day on time?

- ⇒ Socialising with friends
- ⇒ Part of a continuous learning journey where no gaps in learning and skill development is missing
- ⇒ Opportunities to take part in extra curricular activities—School trips/special days/special events
- ⇒ Social, Emotion, Mental Health Support (Interventions, check-ins)
- ⇒ Develop resilience and learn how to face and tackle challenges and new learning

How can I help my child?

- ⇒ Get organised—have your child's school uniform, book bag and packed lunch ready the night before
- ⇒ Set an alarm
- ⇒ Create a morning routine (This may be: Wake Up. Downstairs for breakfast. Upstairs to get dressed and brush teeth. Shoes on, coat on, bag on back. Leave)
- ⇒ Make sure you keep an eye on the time first thing in the morning so that your child arrives punctually
- ⇒ Make medical or dental appointments outside of school hours
- ⇒ Ensure that wherever possible, holidays are booked during the school holidays. If this is unavoidable, you must request a Withdrawal from Learning form from the school office

School Starts at 8:45am.

Classroom doors are open at this time.

Classroom doors close at 8:50am.

If you arrive after this time, you MUST sign your child in through the office, explaining why you are late.

Help your child to achieve by giving them the best chances on their journey.

Get your child to school every day, on time!







Attendance Process

We follow Leeds City Council Policy and Procedures for attendance, as do all other schools in Leeds.

Key Questions and Answers

What do I do if my child is unwell?

- ⇒ Decide whether your child is unwell enough to stay at home. Could they attend school to see how they go?
- ⇒ Contact the school office on 0113 831 5551 to inform us of your child's absence and the reason for this before 8.45 am

If we have not heard from you by this time or if we do not have a reason for absence...

- ⇒ The school office will CHECK that your child is not in the building by going to your child's class-room.
- ⇒ You will receive a text from the school office asking why your child is not in school. Failure to respond to this text will result in a telephone call/ home visit from Mrs Hopton, our school Attendance Officer.

You will then need to inform school each subsequent day your child is off school.

⇒ If we still do not have a reason for your child's absence we will send a letter home asking for this information in writing. It is at the discretion of the Head Teacher to determine if the absence will be recorded as an authorised or unauthorised absence.

What do I do if my child has an unavoidable medical appointment?

- ⇒ We understand that certain appointments are unavoidable, hospital appointments in particular. If you need to take your child to an appointment during school hours you will need to bring proof of the appointment to the school office.
- ⇒ Hospital appointments with proof of appointment will be authorised. However, general GP and dentist appointments during school hours will mean that your child's overall attendance percentage decreases.
