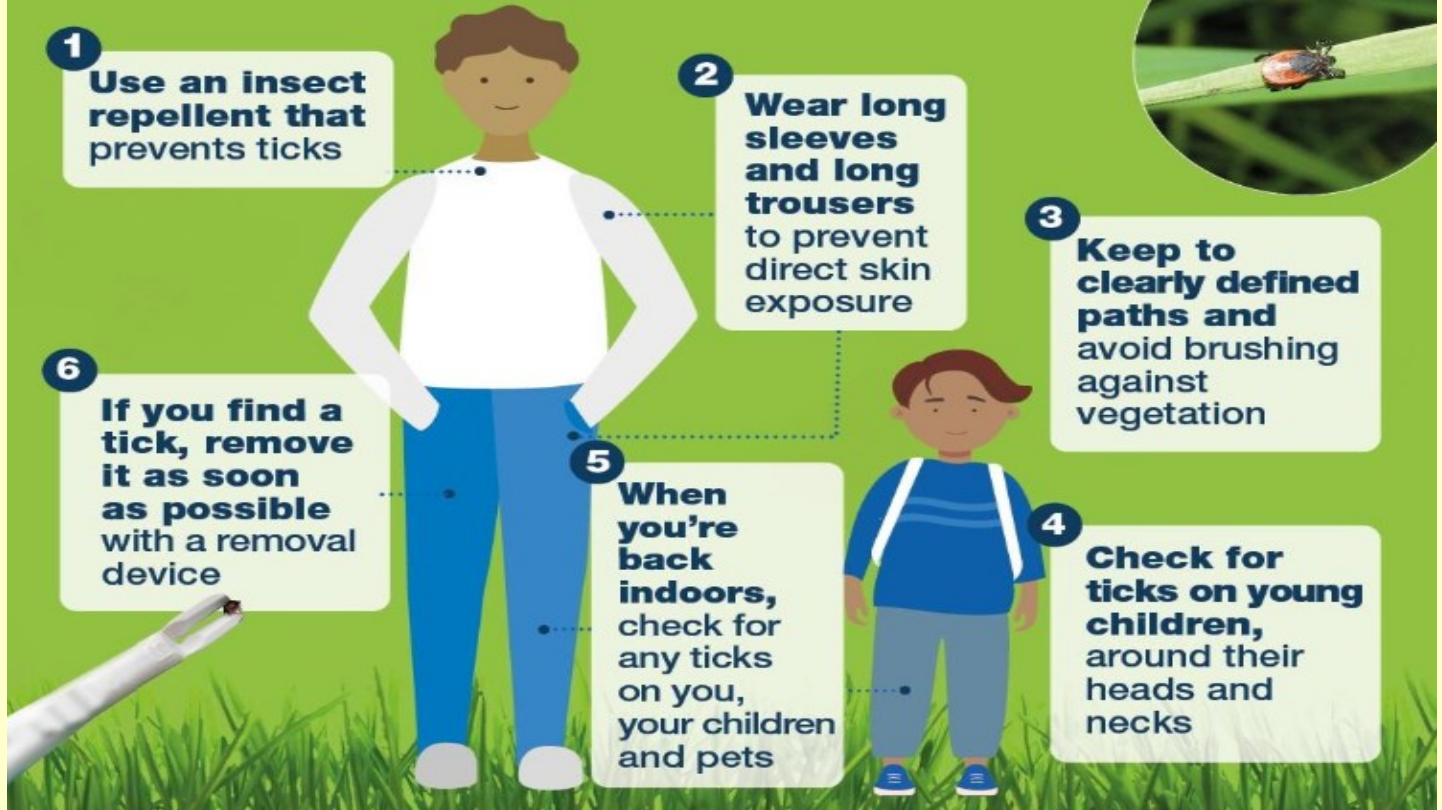


Summer School Fair
