# The Water Safety Code

The Water Safety Code helps us to keep safe in and around water.

## Stop and Think

- Stop and look around you.
- Look for dangers.
- Look for signs and advice.



## Stay Together

- Always be with friends, family or a trusted adult around water.
- Swim where there's a lifeguard.
- It's always safer to go near water with an adult.



## Float

- Stay calm if you fall in water or get tired.
- Float on your back and call for help.
- You could throw something that floats to someone who has fallen in.

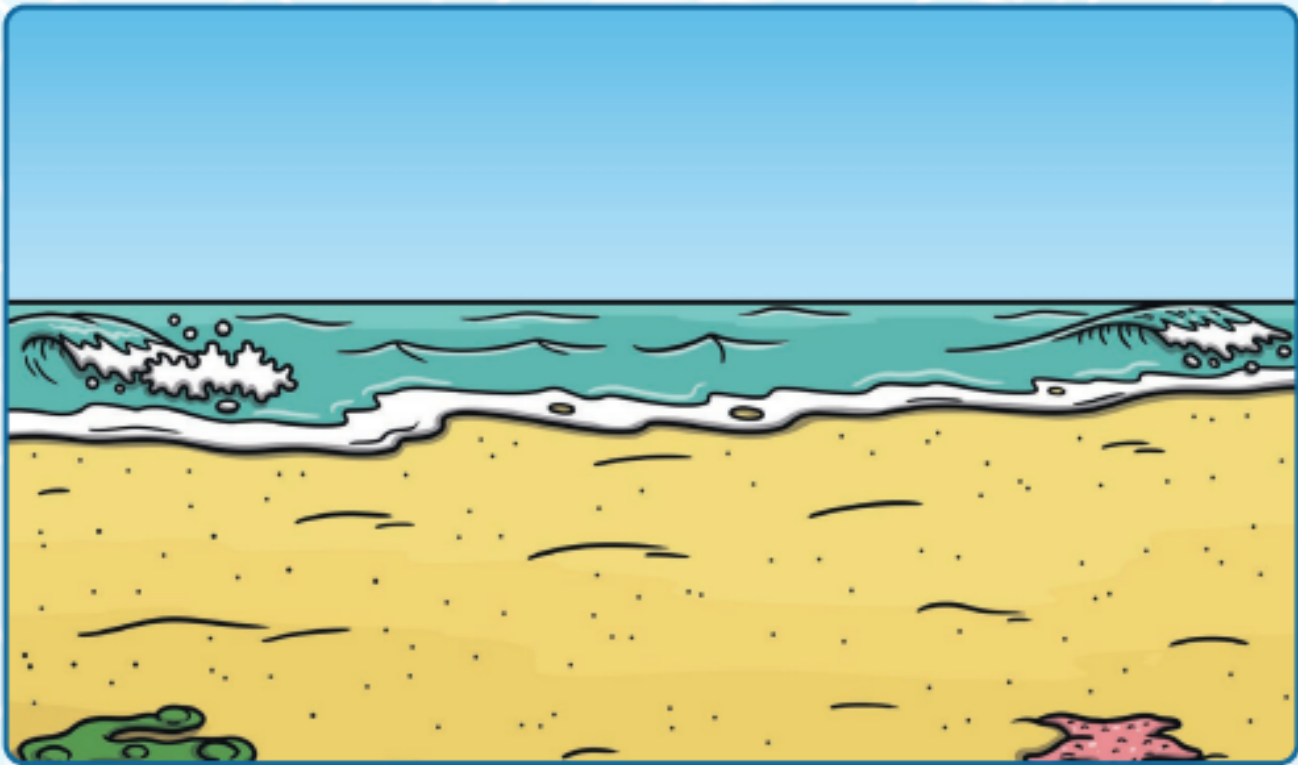


## Call 999 or 112

- Call 999 or 112 and ask for help.
- Ask for the coastguard when at the beach.
- Don't enter the water to try and rescue anyone.



# Safety in Open Water



Be careful when entering the sea. Face the waves so you know when they are coming.

Wear sun protection and suitable clothes.

Do not swim out too far in open water.

Wear protective footwear on rocky and uneven surfaces.

Make sure you can always see a family member or trusted adult.

Swim on a beach with a lifeguard.
