With the half term only a week away, here are some ideas for family fun over the Spring break that you might not know about.

[Crayola's World of Creativity](#) pop-up will be at the OXO Gallery from 2nd-4th. During this immersive event, visitors will be given a Crayola Passport to help them navigate themed interactive zones, including Color Wonder mess-free areas. *Free*

Head to Mosaic Rooms on the 8th for its monthly [Tiny Fridays](#) under-5s session featuring squishy and crunchy materials, tubes, pipes, boxes, crates, dens and more. Then, on the 28th, 0-11s are invited to take part in [Play Lab: Lum'a](#), featuring shadow theatre, Puppet-making, projected backdrops, and open-ended materials. *Free*.

[Dulwich Festival](#) runs from 8th-17th, with family-friendly highlights including a silent disco, maypole dancing, street-art sketching, a teddy bears' picnic, family walks, beat boxing, spring fairs, storytelling and illustration events at Paper Cat Bookshop in Herne Hill, and loads more. *Free/paid*.

[Museum of Illusions](#) opens on Tottenham Court Road from the 8th. Defy gravity, walk into a kaleidoscope, climb the facade of a building without leaving the ground, witness still images come to life – and learn how all of that is possible – across more than 60 interactive exhibits and installations. *Paid*.

Young V&A is hosting two creative sessions on the 9th. Join artist Judith Brocklehurst to invent quirky moving sculptures or body extensions in [Create! Studio for Families](#); or have fun with tactile, open-ended making for children with sensory differences or SEND at [Sensory Friendly Studio for Families](#).

The [Covent Garden May Fayre & Puppet Festival](#) takes place at St Paul's Church Garden on the 10th. Highlights will include a grand procession led by the Superior Brass Band, a special church service with Mr Punch in the pulpit, plus shows, stalls and workshops, folk music and maypole dancing. *Free*.

The Southbank Centre is the place to be this half term. Highlights include [FUNharmonics: Stan and Mabel and the Race for Space](#) on the 17th, [Michael Rosen's Birthday](#) on the 23rd and [Play Along: Virtual Orchestra](#) on 27th-28th. [Chelsea in Bloom](#) and [Belgravia in Bloom](#) both run from 18th-24th. London's largest free-to-attend festival of flowers, this ever-popular floral art show will transform the streets of neighbouring Chelsea and Belgravia with breathtaking installations made from fresh flowers. *Free*.

On the 20th, British Museum is running a [May Day Mini Makers](#) event for 0-5s and their adults. Meet May Queens, Green Men and woodland creatures; stop and smell some floral scents; draw and scribble with a range of art materials; and make crowns and masks to wear for spring festivities in this child-led session. *Free*
