Safety in the Sun

A little bit of sun is healthy and makes us feel good. However, people who lie in sunlight for long periods trying to achieve the perfect tan are putting themselves in danger. Overexposure to the sun can be fatal. Here are a few tips:



Wear a Hat



Your head and face are extremely sensitive. When walking around on a sunny day, always wear a hat to keep them shaded.



Cover Up

Wear a long-sleeved T-shirt to help keep you cool and protect your skin from overexposure and burning.



Apply Sun Cream

Use an SPF 15 or higher on exposed skin. Apply generously before going outside and reapply frequently while in the sun and after swimming.



The Dangers

There is no such thing as a healthy tan. Suntanned skin is sun-damaged skin, which could lead to the following:

- Skin cancer;
- Premature ageing;
- Rough, blotchy skin;
- Sunburn;
- Sunstroke.
