Curriculum

The school will

I will

- Try my best to achieve the next steps in my learning.

Welfare and Communication

- Ensure that children are safe on the school premises and on school trips, administer prescription medicines only with written permission.
- Try, where possible, to book medical appointments outside of school hours.
- Give full and clear information about the curriculum, each child's progress, standard achieved and development needs.
- Contact parents/carers as soon as possible if we are concerned about a child's work or behaviour.
- Communicate regularly with parents about school matters and set dates for school events early and inform parents.



Parents/Carers

I/We will

- Ensure that my child goes to bed early at a reasonable time on weekdays.
- Teach my child about personal hygiene.
- Make sure the school always has at least two up to date emergency contact number.
- Let the school know if there are any problems that affect my child's welfare and/or ability to learn.

Child

I will

• Tell an adult if I feel upset or if something is bothering me.

Behaviour

- Make sure children are aware of and understand the school rules.
- Use rewards and sanctions fairly.
- Ensure that school staff always set a high standard of personal behaviour.
- Respect the views of children and parents acknowledging different circumstances that exist.
- Not tolerate any form of bullying.



Parents/Carers

I/We will

- Help my child understand and follow the school rules.
- Encourage my child to care for school property both at school and at home.
- Behave in a way that sets children a good example when I am on school premises.

Child

I will

- Keep to the school rules and behave well.
- Always try to be the best I can be.
- Be polite and helpful to other children and all adults.
- Take good care of the school property and school environment.

Equal Opportunities

- Try to enable all children to take part in all activities.
- Celebrate the diverse backgrounds that we come from.
- Ensure that bullying and racist, sexist and other discriminating behaviour is not tolerated.
- Will follow the guidelines set out in the Equal Opportunities Act 2010.



Parents/Carers

I/We will

- Help my child understand that everyone is of equal importance.
- Encourage my child to appreciate and respect views, cultures and religions of others.
- Follow the school's single equality policy and anti-bullying policy.

Child

I will

- Be respectful of all children and adults.
- Tell an adult if I need help or are unhappy.

Attendance and Punctuality

- Maintain an accurate record of attendance.
- Contact parents/carers if there is a problem concerning their child's attendance or punctuality.
- Refer (concerns regarding your child's attendance or punctuality) to Early Helps and/or the Local Authority.
- Celebrate good attendance.



Parents/Carer

I/We will

- Ensure my child is in school regularly and on time.
- Make sure that my child is collected on time.
- Contact the school promptly when my child is absent.
- Avoid taking holidays or extended leave during term time (unless under approved circumstances).

Child

I will

• Come to school each day on time and ready to learn.

Homework

The school will

- Regularly set and mark homework linked to the child's in class learning.
- Explain its purpose, and how it should be done.
- Give reasonable time frames for homework to be handed in.
- Mark homework regularly and in accordance with our marking and feedback policy.

Parents/carer

I/We will

 Provide encouragement and support for my child/ren as they complete their homework.



- Provide an appropriate workplace within the home.
- Monitor all homework to ensure work is of a high standard.
- Share concerns with the teacher if any area of work appears to be giving my child/ren particular concern.
- Value the range of homework that may be given to your child to take home.

Child

I will

- Listen when homework is being explained.
- Ask for an explanation if I do not understand.
- Try my best when working at home.
- Complete and hand in my homework on time.

School Uniform

The school will

- Ensure that all children wear school uniform correctly.
- Ensure that the school uniform policy shows sensitivity towards the cultural needs of all its pupils.

Parents/Carers

I/We will

• Support and follow the school's uniform policy fully and liaising with the school where a problem arises.



Child
