## Kent Meningitis Outbreak - Information for Parents

There is currently an outbreak of [meningococcal disease](#) (MenB) in Kent.

All of the cases identified to date are connected with Kent and there is no evidence currently that this outbreak has spread further. The risk of infection to our local population remains low, this is because the MenB bacterium does not easily spread from person to person.

### **What causes meningitis?**

In the UK, most cases of meningitis are due to bacteria or viruses. Some of the bacteria that cause meningitis can also lead to septicaemia (blood poisoning), and both conditions can result in sepsis, which is life-threatening.

Vaccination provides protection against some common strains of meningitis. Knowing the signs and symptoms of this rare but serious illness and acting quickly, is also important.

### **How do I protect my child from meningitis?**

Parents are recommended to check in their children's Red Book that their children have had **all** their routine vaccinations, and be sure that they know the [symptoms of meningitis](#).





