This week, we finished our work with Project
Touchline after 5 weeks of Collective Worships,
rugby lessons and prayer club – all of which helped
everyone in the school community to think better
about how we can use our school values in every
day life.

Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 have had weekly rugby lessons. Here they have learnt a series of games such as Lions and Rabbits and Sharks and Seals. In these games, the children have not only developed their rugby skills but have also thought carefully about how to show our values – for example they shake hands to show compassion after winning a game and use wisdom to ensure they play the game safely.

A highlight of the project has been the lunch time prayer club. This has been open to any child in Year 1 to 6 who has chosen to attend. It proved so popular that we had to split the group into two.

Project Touchline is all about legacy, so we are very much planning to continue the good work. Prayer Club will continue in some form, so do look out for more information about

that, and we hope the children will continue playing the rugby games in the playground. Of course, we will also continue to use our school values in every area of our school life so that we can continue to live out our school vision.
