Homework Policy

1. Introduction

The school policy for homework was developed and agreed by the teaching staff, taking into account parental views, to set minimum expectations for the setting and marking of homework across school to enhance and consolidate children's learning and attainment.

2. Aims of the Policy

The aim of the policy is to: -

- Inform staff and parents regarding the expectations for homework throughout school;
- provide opportunities for parents, children and school staff to work in partnership;
- ensure that parents and carers have a clear understanding about expectations of themselves and their child;
- improve the quality of learning experiences offered to the children;
- extend and support the learning experiences via reinforcement, consolidation and revision;
- provide a selection of activities which encourage parents to become actively involved in their child's learning;
- encourage the children to develop long term strategies for future needs;

In Year 6:

- prepare the children for their transfer to the next phase of education;
- Establish a regular pattern of set homework.

3. Responsibilities

The Headteacher is responsible for:

ensuring that all staff are aware of the policy;

- working alongside their children to complete their homework.

Pupils are responsible for:-

- completing their homework on time
