Back in September 2021 when we returned to school after Covid, a brand new PTA was set up by Leanne Anthony (Chair), Selina Johnson (Vice Chair), Laura Kyte (Treasurer) and Charlotte Russell (Secretary). Over the years, new members joined the PTA committee and some others left but the core team of Leanne, Selina and Laura remained until Leanne stepped down in July 2025 due to her youngest child leaving St John's.

We are very proud of the smart appearance of the children at St John's. Our uniform policy reflects the high expectations we have as a school.

Grey school style trousers, skirt, pinafore dress (*where girls prefer to wear trousers these must be grey and regular fitting or boot cut in style (leggings or skinny fit trousers are not permitted)*)

Grey socks, bottle green or dark grey tights, or white socks

Hair accessories must be dark green, black or white.

Children should not wear make-up, nail varnish or tattoos to school.

With the exception of the St John's sweatshirts and cardigans (with the school logo) **which are compulsory** and can only be ordered from PMG Schoolwear, all other items can be purchased from a range of high street stores and

supermarkets.

Children are required to wear black school style shoes. (Trainers, ballet pumps, open-toed shoes and boots are not permitted)

Scooters and Bicycles in School

Please could all parents remind children that scooters and bicycles ARE NOT to be ridden on school grounds, they must be dismounted at the school gate and walked in.

We had an incident last week where a grandparent who had come to collect at pick up was knocked into by a child riding a scooter and this resulted in a nasty fall which needed a visit to the hospital.

It has also come to our attention that there have been several 'near misses' between cars and children on bikes and scooters and, concerningly, there have been occasions where children have been without a helmet. We want to encourage all parents to speak to their children about the seriousness of road and cycling safety, and how crucial it is for all children to be wearing helmets when they are cycling and scooting.

If there are any families who are struggling to source helmets for their children, please reach out to Alaina Tabern (Child and Family Support Worker) who can support with signposting to other agencies who may be able to help secure cycling safety equipment. Library News

Summer Reading Challenge 2026

This year's Summer Reading Challenge theme is: **Read to the Beat!**

The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children to keep reading during the school summer holidays and to choose anything they enjoy to read! It's free to take part and children can sign up at their local library or sign up on the official challenge website to take part online. The website is **summerreadingchallenge.org.uk**. Children can set a reading goal and get tips for accessing books for free at home. Libraries offer lots of free activities and events throughout the summer.

What is the Summer Reading Challenge?

1 in 4 children cannot read well by the age of 11. This hugely limits their life choices and skills. The Reading Agency is on a mission to change this. The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children to keep reading during the summer holidays, ensuring they are ready for a great start to the new term in the Autumn. Children set a reading goal and collect rewards for reading anything they enjoy.

The 2026 theme is all about harnessing the universal appeal of music to inspire a new generation of readers.

Read to the Beat! Is created in partnership with Universal Music Group UK. Every year, the Summer Reading Challenge plays a vital role in keeping children excited about books. This year's collection is particularly special as it celebrates the universal language of music – from drumming and dancing to orchestras, opera, rap, K-pop and everything in between. This year's challenge is brought to life with illustrations by award-winning author and illustrator, Harry Woodgate. The 2026 SRC collection features 55 captivating titles for different reading levels, spanning early readers, and middle grade titles, as well as dyslexia-friendly titles. With a rich mix of fiction, non-fiction, poetry, and graphic novels. The collection has been carefully curated to get young readers tapping their feet and turning pages. The books will be available to borrow for free from public libraries.

How the Challenge Works

Sign-up: Children are invited to borrow and read any six library books of their choice (including audiobooks, comics, and e-books) over the summer break. The challenge officially launches in England and Wales on **Saturday 4th July 2026** (earlier in Scotland).

Collect Rewards: As participants read, they collect special stickers and character cards for each of their reading goals.

Completion: Readers who complete six books receive a special stickers and character finisher's medal.

Don't forget younger siblings either. The Summer Reading Mini Challenge, designed for children aged three and under, uses the same sticker and collector card format to bring families with pre-schoolers into the library fold – building the reading habit from the very beginning.

Andrew Bayliss, the Manager of Carterton Library, will be visiting the school assembly on Monday 29th June to talk to the children about the Summer Reading Challenge.

Andrew and his colleagues would love you and your children to visit Carterton Library. Other local libraries will be taking part too. Remember the challenge is free!

20 days they have missed playing with their friends.

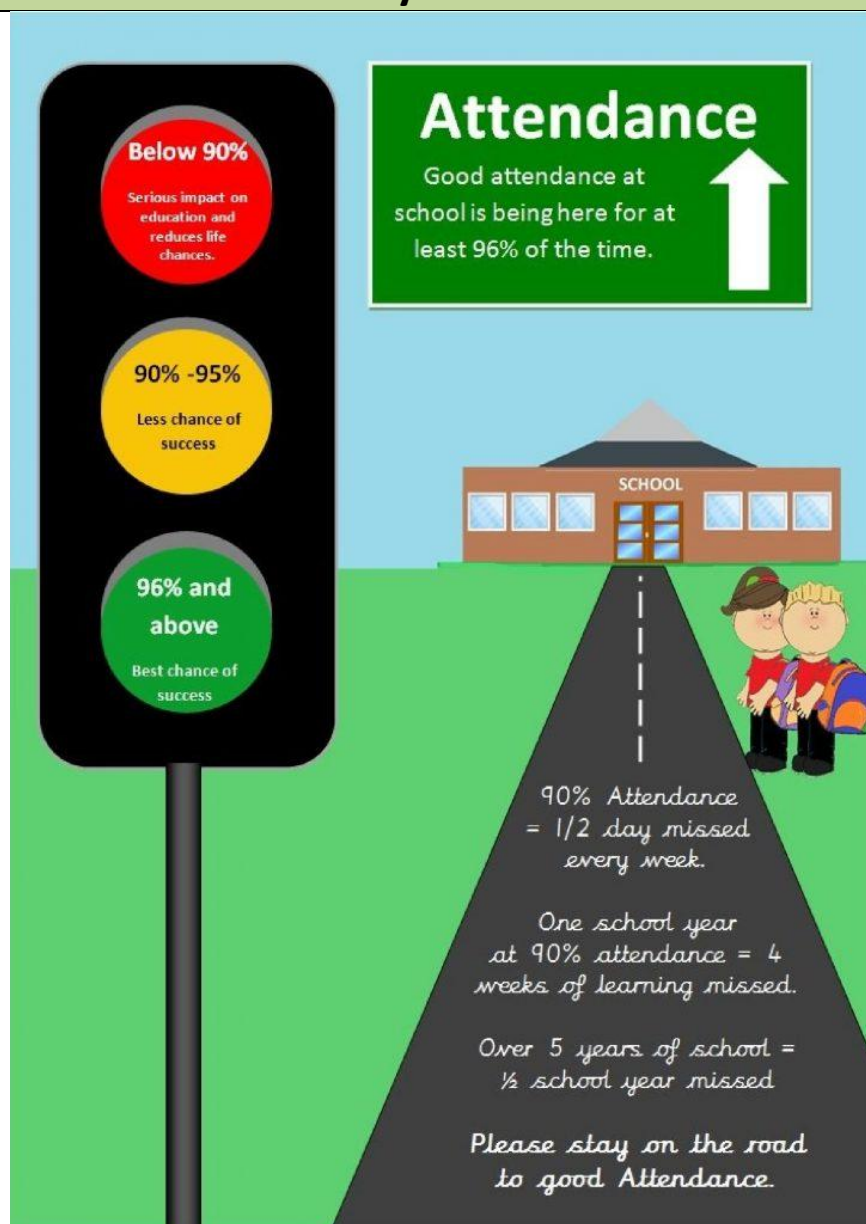
In Reception and Year 1 this is 20 phonic sounds they have missed that are vital for learning to read.

For the first time since the 1970s, a dragon will be returning to our High Street. The dragon parade was a popular annual event commemorating a famous battle in Burford between King Aethelbald of Mercia and King Cuthred of the West Saxons in AD 752.

From 11.00am Hwitmeaurum the Oxfordshire group of Regia Anglorum, a national re-enactment group, will be demonstrating skilled crafts of the period in their Living History Village in the grounds of the Primary School. At 11.30am combat warriors will prepare themselves for battle and, along with heralds, will make their way to the recreation ground bearing banners.

At 1.15pm, after the children's fancy dress costumes are judged and prizes given, there will be a combat re-enactment by the warriors on the recreation field.

At 2.00pm the Dragon Parade will be lead down Burford Hill to the Living History Village at the Primary School where tea, cakes and drinks will be available, courtesy of the Parent Teacher Association.

Morris dancers and Burford School Jazz Band will perform along the route and the Living History Village and fête will end at 3.00pm.
