Admission for Reception Class for September 2026

Please note that the deadline for reception place applications for September 2026 is the 15th January.

If your child was born on or between 1st September 2021 and 31 August 2022, you need to apply for a primary school place now. Even though your child has a Nursery place currently, this does not qualify your child for automatic entry into the Primary School.

After School Clubs

Please see the letter emailed home today. As it is a short term, the booking system is only open for 48 hours from Friday 9th January at 7pm and will close on Sunday 11th January at 7pm.

Pupil Premium and Forces Premium

The school receives extra funding for children who are entitled to free school meals or whose parents are serving in the armed forces. This is a major source of funding for our school, allowing us to provide additional support for the children.

Now that our younger children all receive a free school lunch, it may seem less important to apply for free school meals. This is not the case and failure to register will result in the school losing funding for each eligible pupil. If you are eligible, you may also get access to subsidised trips and music lessons.

There are several criteria for entitlement, including if the parent receives income support, or income-related allowances. If you think you are, or may be, entitled to this, please contact the School Office for details on how to apply. If you are eligible and you have children in Years 3 to 6, they will also receive a free school meal.

In addition, if you are a parent and are employed in the Armed Forces, please let us know.

Year 5 Maple and Sycamore Classes

From January, children in Year 5 will be allowed to walk home independently if parental consent has been given. Please visit School Gateway to advise if your child can walk home independently at the end of the school day or at 4pm if attending an After School Club.

Young Carers Provision

Dear Parents and Carers,

As some of you may be aware, we run a provision here at school for those children who are classed as Young Carers.

A Young Carer is a child or young person under 18 who provides, or intends to provide support to another person who:

- Has a long-term health condition
- Has an additional need or disability
- Has a mental health condition
- Has a drug or alcohol dependency
- Requires extra help as they grow older

Importantly, children who provide any extra help to parents in the home for any of the above reasons, or a sibling with any medical or SEN needs could be included in the identification criteria.

A Young Carer does not necessarily need to be living in the same home as the person needing support. We want to ensure that young carers at our school are identified and get the recognition and support they deserve, helping them to thrive. We are aware of some Young Carers in our school already, but we know there are likely to be many more whom we are not yet aware of.

We are lucky that West Oxfordshire has recently had the Be Free YC (<https://befreeyc.org.uk/>) available as a service that we can refer into. Be Free YC is a fantastic service that provides mentoring and activities to identified Young Carers. We will also be offering a regular lunch club in school for any identified Young Carers, as well as regular opportunities to take part in extra activities within the school community. Young Carers within school will be supported by Alaina Tabern (Child and Family Support Worker) and Alex Cockett (Nurture Teaching Assistant)

We are asking that all parents who feel that their child could be considered a Young Carer to please contact Alaina Tabern directly (atabern@st-john.oxon.sch.uk). Alaina can then discuss available avenues of support both in and outside of school.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS



Thank you to parents for getting your children into school on time so that they do not miss any learning or feel unsettled because they have arrived after routines have been established for the day.

In line with our school policies, please remember to communicate your child's absence everyday by 9am at the latest. If your child is absence and has a school lunch booked, please remember to cancel their lunch via SchoolGrid. This saves on wasted food and an unnecessary charge.

Reporting your child as absent: As a school we have a duty of care to safeguard all our children. Ensuring children attend school regularly is part of the safeguarding duty for both school and parents and absences MUST be recorded in registers with reasons for the child not attending each day.

Please can we politely remind parents that you must contact the school and notify us of your child's absence before the school day starts. Lateness is recorded from 8.45am when registers are taken.

Any child absent without a valid reason provided by parents or carers by 9.15am has to be marked as an unauthorised absence. The Local Authority monitor the school registers and if you are not reporting your child's absence this could result in families being referred to the Attendance Team as your child is then classed as 'Missing Education'.

This is why it is so important we are notified on each and every morning of absence please.

Each week we promote and celebrate good attendance across the school. Research shows that poor attendance limits pupils' life chances, impacts on children's academic success but more worryingly adversely affects children socially and emotionally.

We do not authorise family holidays in term time, long weekends, or special visits/trips/half days for example. At the end of the school year we have blocked INSET days to support families in booking holidays before other schools across the country break up. As you may have seen on the news at the start of term, the government have tightened regulations on persistent absence and the use of penalty notices for term time holidays.

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
