Bookings for Wrap-Around Care (Breakfast Club & After School Care)

Whilst we appreciate that there may be occasions when wrap-around care is required at very short notice, we would like to remind parents that bookings should be made in advance if at all possible. You can book wrap-around care up to midnight of the day before, so please keep this in mind and make your child's bookings in advance.

If you do need to make a last minute booking (after the booking deadline), please ensure that there are sufficient funds in your child's account and email the booking details to Mrs Russell.

Lunch Money

I have noticed that a number of parents are still paying lunch money in multiples of £2.50. Please note that the cost of a school meal is now £2.60 a day. Please ensure that you make payments in multiples of this in order to avoid a shortfall.

Measles

Measles is an infection that spreads very easily and can cause serious problems in some people. Having the MMR vaccine is the best way to prevent it.

Check if you or your child has measles

Measles usually starts with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash a few days later. Some people may also get small spots in their mouth.

Cold-like symptoms

The first symptoms of measles include:

- a high temperature
- a runny or blocked nose
- sneezing
- a cough
- red, sore, watery eyes

Spots in the mouth




Small white spots may appear inside the cheeks and on the back of the lips a few days later. These spots usually last a few days.

The measles rash



A rash usually appears a few days after the cold-like symptoms.

The rash starts on the face and behind the ears before spreading to the rest of the body.



The spots of the measles rash are sometimes raised and join together to form blotchy patches. They're not usually itchy.

The rash looks brown or red on white skin. It may be harder to see on brown and black skin.

Ask for an urgent GP appointment or get help from NHS 111 if:

- you think you or your child may have measles
- you've been in close contact with someone who has measles and you've not had measles before or you've not had 2 doses of the MMR vaccine
- you've been in close contact with someone who has measles and you're pregnant – measles can be serious in pregnancy
- you have a weakened immune system and think you have measles or have been in close contact with someone with measles

Measles can spread to others easily. Call your GP surgery before you go in. They may suggest talking over the phone.

You can also call 111 or [get help from 111 online](#).

How to look after yourself or your child

Measles usually starts to get better in about a week.

After seeing a GP, there are things you can do to help ease the symptoms and reduce the risk of spreading the infection.

It can help to:

- rest and drink plenty fluids, such as water, to avoid dehydration
- take paracetamol or ibuprofen to relieve a high temperature – do not give aspirin to children under 16 years
- use cotton wool soaked in warm water to gently remove any crusts from your or your child's eyes

Important

Stay off nursery, school or work for at least 4 days from when the rash first appears.

Also try to avoid close contact with babies and anyone who is pregnant or has a weakened immune system.
