Prayer in action

In our Friday assembly this week, we focussed and reflected on the meaning and power of prayer. This week's Gospel has Jesus telling a widow to never give up praying – God is listening, even when it appears not to be the case.

Our children have been given the mission, inspired by Pope Francis, to pray 'with action'.

Prayer, without action, is a lost opportunity, he says. If we pray that our families are happy, but don't act in a way that makes them happy, then the prayer is just words. We must follow up with actions that help those prayers be answered.

Help your children to focus on one or two things that they wish to include in their prayers — it might be a small but important thing, such as praying for a sick relative or friend, or a huge thing, like praying for a more peaceful world. Then...challenge them to think of a small way in which they can help that prayer be answered — sending a card to the sick relative, being more tolerant of those that are different or unfamiliar to us; there are so many ways to help the world be a better place.

Celebration of the Word – Prayer



Word:

Jesus wanted to teach his disciples that they should always pray and never give up. So he told them a story. He said, "There was a judge who didn't care about God or other people. In his town, a widow kept coming to him, asking, 'Please give me justice!'

At first, the judge refused. But after a while he said, 'This woman won't stop asking. I'll help her so she'll leave me alone!'

Then Jesus said, "If even a selfish judge finally helped someone who didn't give up, imagine how much more God—who loves you—will help those who keep praying to Him."

Gospel according to Luke

Reflect:

Pope Francis said, "Prayer that doesn't lead to concrete action toward our brothers is a fruitless and incomplete prayer."

Sometimes prayer can feel like nothing is happening, but Jesus tells us to keep praying and never give up—just like the widow in the story. As Pope Francis reminds us, the best Prayers are linked to action. That's how prayer works!

The Mission?

Mission:

Keep Praying – Pick one thing you want to pray for every day. It could be for a friend, your family, someone who is sick, or even for your school. Pray for it every day and don't give up!

Take Action – Find one way to help with that prayer. If you're praying for a friend, send them a kind note; if it's your family, do something unexpectedly kind for them; if it's your school, work hard and make them proud!

Remember, God listens to your prayers, and He wants you to turn them into love and action for others.

Pray and Do...pick something to pray for, then DO something to help it come true!

Online Safety

Age ratings

Despite age restrictions, many primary school children access popular social media and entertainment platforms. These Apps are NOT recommended for primary aged children, particularly without parental controls and supervision:

YouTube (13+) – Video streaming platform with a separate YouTube Kids app for younger users.

TikTok (13+) – Short-form video-sharing app with a restricted mode for younger users.

Instagram (13+) – Photo and video-sharing social media platform owned by Meta.

Snapchat (13+) – Social media app for sharing disappearing messages and videos.

Roblox (13+ for full access, but children under 13 can have restricted accounts) – Online game creation and playing platform.

Discord (13+) – Chat and voice communication app popular among gamers.

Facebook (13+) – Social media platform, though less commonly used by younger children.

Twitter (now X) (13+) – Social media and microblogging platform.

Twitch (13+) – Live streaming platform, mainly for gaming content.

Reddit (13+) – Forum-based social platform with a variety of discussions.

Online Safety

There are several reliable websites where parents can check age ratings, safety information, and parental controls for apps their children are using. Here are some suggestions:

1. Common Sense Media

- Provides **detailed reviews** of apps, games, movies, and websites.
- Includes age ratings, expert opinions, and parent/child reviews.
- Explains risks such as privacy concerns, in-app purchases, and chat features.

2. ESRB (Entertainment Software Rating Board)

- •Official age ratings for video games and some apps.
- •Helps parents understand the content (e.g., violence, language, online interactions).

3. Google Play Store & Apple App Store

- Official age ratings for each app.
- Found in the **app description** under "Age rating" or "Parental Guidance".

4. Internet Matters

- •UK-based resource with **parent guides on digital safety**.
- Provides app safety advice, age ratings, and parental controls.

5. National Online Safety

- Provides free downloadable safety guides for popular apps.
- Covers potential risks like **cyberbullying**, **privacy**, **and in-app purchases**.




Reception:






Class 4:
