

# Reminders:

## The Christmas Performance – The Christmas Code

### Thursday 11th December

The children must be in class by 6pm on Thursday evening. Entrance for the children will be via the playground gates. Reception Class children - entrance will be via the Nursery gate.

The performance starts at 6.30pm, entrance for parents and carers will be via the school office.

Parents and carers MUST have a ticket to come in.

**Please don't come without your ticket as you will be turned away. ONE TICKET ADMITS 1 ADULT, children under 5 are not allowed to the evening performance.**

**After the performance:** parents will be asked to collect their children from their classroom doors, **no child will be allowed to go home without their parent / carer.** Reception Class children will be released to parents via the Nursery gate.

### Friday 12th December

Children must be in class at the normal time of 8.50am. Please don't be late for school. The Christmas performance starts at 9.15am. Parents and carers do not need a ticket to come to the performance on Friday morning. Entrance to the show for parents and carers will be via the school office.
