movement break later, it might be spending some time with a member of the leadership team, it might be a phone call home). Where we find that children respond most positively to any consequence and are able to then make a change in their behaviour, is where the same messages about expectations are repeated at home. Thank you for your support in ensuring our school is a calm and safe space; as ever, school and families working together is always so beneficial to the children. We will soon be holding an informal coffee morning to discuss how we can all best support behaviour, including how clear boundaries (both within school and home) can help children feel secure. We will let you know this date as soon as possible and look forward to chatting with lots of you there.

It has been lovely to see the children looking so smart! To help all of us (families included!) please ensure all items of clothing are clearly labelled. For health and safety reasons children with pierced ears should wear <u>small studs</u> only to school. Hoops are not permitted. Earrings cannot be worn for P.E. so please remove your child's earrings before they come to school on P.E. days if they cannot do it themselves. We will soon be updating our school logo on our uniform; this is only a slight refresh and does not mean that anything new will need to be ordered.

Wednesday & Friday

Attendance

Thank you for all of your support as we have started the school year with ensuring attendance is a high priority. As you know, children are much more settled and make better progress when they are in school every day and on time.

If your child is absent it is important to please telephone the school office or report it online via the 'contact us' page on our website. Please do not only tell the teacher as they may not have time to pass the message on. If your child has an appointment please let us know as soon as possible and let the office have a copy of the appointment letter.

School holiday dates are given below and are also on our website.

A reminder that school starts at **8.45 am** and children should be lined up in their classes, ready to go into school with their teacher, at this time. If you arrive after the gates are locked please bring your child to the school office, please do not leave them until a member of staff has let them through the door. Please do not leave children unsupervised on the school playground when you arrive in the morning. For safety reasons, the play equipment should not be used before and after school.

Family Support Worker

Lisa, our Family Support Worker, will continue to be in school regularly. If you would like to make an appointment to speak to her, please contact the school office.

School Meals

School lunches can be ordered via School Food United. The cut off point for orders to be placed or amended is 9am the day prior to the lunch being required. If any amendments are needed after the cut off, please liaise with School Food United directly.

Free School Meals

If you feel you may be entitled to income-based free school meals please make sure you go to the Worcestershire County Council website to apply for them Apply for free school meals | Worcestershire County Council. Children who are entitled to income based free school meals are also entitled to free milk. Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 (and gets the Universal Infant Free School Meals) or doesn't wish to take up the school meals it is important to apply as the school gets additional funding which means that we can support your child with additional opportunities such as subsidising clubs and music lessons; this funding is also used to benefit all children in school. If an older sibling is in school already you will still need to apply online for the younger child.
