

EYFS

EYFS have been practising their hopping and jumping skills in PE this week. We have been learning how to hopscotch, how to jump for speed and jump for distance.

Year 1

In science this week the children have been learning all about mammals. We have discovered that some of us have mammals living in our homes! The children were very excited by this and loved learning about what mammals live in each others houses. This system must also be used if you are taking your child for an appointment before the end of the school day.



Reminder for children not to bring toys to school

I am keeping this message on the newsletter this week, as children are still bringing toys and teddies to school.

This is a reminder that we ask children to keep personal toys, collectible items and other playthings at home. While we understand children love their special items, bringing them to school can unfortunately create distractions and lead to lost or broken possessions, causing distress for everyone involved.

Teachers are aware of those children who require additional items in class and this will continue to be the case.



It's not ok to be away!

There is no entitlement in law for term-time extended absences, whether these are to visit relatives, attend weddings or funerals, or just for a holiday.



The impact on your child...

Your child misses out on valuable learning when they are absent, which may never be made up. This is true for children at nursery, throughout primary right up to the end of secondary school.

Children with **good** attendance perform better than those with **poor** attendance.

Your child's Primary education is just as important as their Secondary Education. Early Years lay the foundation.

Taking your child out of education teaches disrespect for the importance of learning.

Children often have social difficulties when they return after an extended absence. Friendships may have moved on and their self-confidence and well-being can be affected.

Please support your child's future by ensuring you do not take them out of school during term time.

Your child should have brought home their raffle tickets for the Valentines' Hampers. These will be drawn on Friday 13th February.




World Book Day


