

This week at Harewood

This week has been a busy week in **Turquoise Class**. Year 1 have been finishing off their recounts about Neil Armstrong and Reception children have been writing excellent sentences including new sounds. In maths this week, Year 1 have been introduced to fractions, and they have been learning to identify halves and quarters of shapes and groups. Reception children have been busy exploring shapes, making connections between 2D and 3D shapes as well as making complex patterns. In RE, the children have learned about Holi, the festival of colours, and have made colourful trees using tissue paper to represent the celebration. For the end of our golf PE unit, the children practised their putting techniques to the best of their ability and aimed for a target, really focusing on co-ordination. In **Blue Class** this week, the Year 1 children




finished writing a recount of Neil Armstrong's life and the Reception children again used their phonic knowledge to write simple words and sentences. In geography, the children conducted fieldwork to count how many types of vehicles pass the school and then discussed what the findings told us about the local area. In RE, the children looked at different celebrations from around the world and, specifically, the Hindu celebration of Holi. In science, the Year 1 children showed off all the knowledge they have gained this term about materials by completing the end of unit test with confidence. In maths, the Year 1 children have been learning about positions and directions, such as left, right, forwards,

backwards, above and below. In **Lilac Class** this week, the Year One children completed their recount of Neil Armstrong's moon landing and Reception wrote simple sentences and phrases in response to pictures. In maths, Reception have practised finding double and half of a number, and Year One have been practising adding by counting on. All of the children enjoyed exploring colour mixing and learning about warm and cool colours. They also had a go at creating some watery art for our new topic using the wax resist technique. It was tricky but they were proud of what they achieved! Everyone had a lovely time in Forest School exploring the nature area and spotting some of the signs of spring.

This week in **Yellow Class**, Year One wrote recounts of the first moon landing whilst Reception worked hard on spelling words using their phonic knowledge. We all enjoyed looking at videos and pictures documenting the first moon landing and had some brilliant discussions about it. In PE, the children enjoyed practicing their golfing skills and in geography, we carried out a transport survey, observing the traffic outside of school. We came back and talked about what we had found after collecting the data. The children also enjoyed some creative Easter activities. **Green Class** have all worked so hard in this final week of term. Year One finished their recount writing of the Apollo 11 Mission and Reception continued developing their writing skills too. In maths, Year One worked on recognising fractions of shapes and quantities whilst Reception learned about the properties of 3D shapes and making repeating patterns. In geography, we went on a field trip and did a local traffic survey then discussed our results from our tally charts. In history, we collaged a picture of the globe, imagining we were Neil Armstrong on the moon looking back at the world below. In RE, we re-capped our work on Holi and Easter and decorated a celebration cake.



This week in **Red Class**, the children have been busy writing imaginative stories about a cow travelling to the South Pole, using exciting adjectives and interesting adverbs. In maths, they have begun exploring ways to record and interpret data, linking this learning to their computing lessons too. In history, the children enjoyed comparing Victorian explorers with modern-day explorers, thinking carefully about how exploration has changed over time. They also had great fun creating Easter crafts and sharing ideas about events that are special to them. In music, the children composed their own bars of



music, creating individual symbols to represent notes. They then enjoyed performing their pieces to the class. This week in **Orange Class**, the children have worked incredibly hard across all subjects. In English, they wrote a retell of Something to Tell the Grandcows, carefully sequencing events and using their own ideas. In maths, the children learned about time and then moved on to think about data. In DT, they evaluated their tie-dye flags, reflecting on what went well and what they might improve. In science, the children explored the journey food makes from farm to supermarket,

developing their understanding of where food comes from. To end the week, everyone had a great time at Forest School. This week in **Pink Class** the children have completed a unit about living things in science, looking at food chains and habitats. They also loved having a go at tie dye, by designing and creating their own flag for one of the explorers they have learned about this term. In maths we have been working on data, and in English they have been recounting a fact based story about an Antarctic adventure.
