Harewood Infant School

October 10th 2025 This week at Harewood

The children in **Turquoise Class** have continued to enjoy our 'Nocturnal Animals' topic this week. The Year Ones have written super owl facts and all of the children have been looking after the hedgehogs in our hedgehog hospital role play area. They have all learnt songs and chants about nocturnal animals, adding a beat using body percussion and claves. They have also been sculptors, creating hedgehogs out of clay. This week in **Blue Class** the children have been learning



lots of facts about owls and the Year 1 children wrote a report about the facts they could recall. The Reception children learnt to say, recognise and write the sounds r, j, v, and y. In RE, the children explored non-religious naming/welcome ceremonies and they each thought of a promise they could make to a baby to help them. In art, the children made a hedgehog sculpture out of clay and were very proud of the results. In maths, the Year 1 children have been introduced to part, part whole bar models and have been exploring the number sentences they can write using the information in the

bar model. Reception have met number 3 in its triangular house and have explored finding, writing and counting to 3 as well as finding 1 more and 1 less than 3. In **Lilac Class** this week, the children have been creating some cubist art in the style of Pablo Picasso. They drew nocturnal animals and filled them with geometric shapes before colouring them and sticking on the animal's features. They also had a go at creating some cubist art digitally and then talked about which method they

preferred and why. In geography, the children enjoyed looking at aerial maps and then used their knowledge to carry out some fieldwork on the school site. In PE, they practiced negotiating pace safely and enjoyed playing games where they had to sneak up on the teacher. In RE, they learned about the Hindu festival of Raksha Bandhan and enjoyed making cards and bracelets.



This week in Yellow Class the children have been exploring the different celebrations that people have when babies are



born. They have learned about naming ceremonies and thought about the promises that people make to babies when they are born. They also learned about the Hindu festival of Raksha Bandhan and how this marks the bond of love and protection between siblings. They children made their own Rakhi (a bracelet) to take home and give to someone to show their love. This week the Reception children have enjoyed their first Forest School lesson where they have been learning the rules and exploring our nature area. The children looked for signs of Autumn and noticed how the trees are changing at this

time of year. This week in **Green Class** the children have been learning all about owls. They have used the facts they learned to do some brilliant writing. In maths, the Reception children have been learning to write and find the number 3. The Year One children have been comparing numbers and using number lines to find one more and one less from a range of numbers. In art this week, the children have been using their sculpting skills to make some lovely clay hedgehogs. They all took their time and painted them beautifully.

Red Class have worked hard this week to write their own story. Their character and setting descriptions were so brilliant that we put them into an Al tool which created pictures for them. We had such a great time! In history, the children

researched David Attenborough and Charles Darwin and then presented their findings back to the class. Everyone enjoyed their quiz in science and also made some wonderful art work. The children worked well in a team during PE and also had great fun in Sports Friday. In **Orange Class** this week, one of our favourite lessons was history where we learned about the lives of Sir David Attenborough and Charles Darwin. We worked together in teams to make fact files about these two influential people. In music, we learned about pulse and dynamics. We sang along to 'Down in the Jungle' and made up our own actions and words to the song. In PE, we continued to explore space and had great fun playing a few team
