## **School Buildings**

Following our recent extension and alterations programme, we have successfully bid for funding from Hertfordshire County Council to completely renew the heating and hot and cold-water systems to the Orchard Building (the older of our two buildings). This will ensure the building is fit for purpose and as efficient as possible for the years to come. The work will begin over the course of the school holiday. The works will continue during the first half of the autumn term, when the contractors will start working after the end of the school days, each day and into the evening. As before, we will need to make space for storage and delivery of materials and for a small number of contractors' vehicles which may result in our having to make some temporary changes to access to the school carpark. We will keep parents informed of this as and when necessary.


We look forward to seeing everyone then.
