THIS WEEK IN SCHOOL

Our Year 4 children have enjoyed an activity-packed workshop day in school on Monday and Thursday this week, learning about *Life in Roman Britain* in their *History Off the Page* workshops. Dressed in Roman apparel, they followed the story of Queen Boudica's uprising against the occupying Romans and that of a fictitious spy in the Roman camp. Participating in various hands-on activities, such as metal work and mosaics, and making perfume from native herbs for the bathhouse, they learnt about the many benefits brought to these islands by the Romans.



Next week our Reception pupils will be pirates for the day on Tuesday in their workshop day. I can't wait to see what they get up to!

Our Year 6 pupils enjoyed a visit to Katherine Warington School on Wednesday to watch the dress rehearsal of their contemporary adaptation of Shakespeare's a Midsummer Night's Dream. As well as inspiring the children to look forward to their move to secondary education, it was great to see quite a number of High Beeches alumni flourishing in the cast and crew of the production.

Also this week, our year groups have completed their latest showcase displays in the school hall. This term they highlight the current writing work undertaken by each year group. 

