The February half-term is upon us. Be Safe Week

This week has been our annual *Be Safe Week* and some of the children's usual lessons and activities have been replaced with special visits, visitors or workshops with a focus on understanding risks and how to keep ourselves safe. This is such an important subject and the children have engaged really well with the subject matter and issues they have been exploring.

This has included a focus on safeguarding, using NSPCC materials for an assembly to Years 1 to 6 and in class with our Reception children ([What's in your pants belongs only to you...](#)), work on digital safety (with another assembly led by our pupil Digital Leaders), further cyber safety work with a session for parents and for Year 5 and 6 pupils, led by Hertfordshire Police, local police constables, visiting Year 2, trips to Hazard Alley for Years 5 and 6, Hygiene workshops for Years 1 and 2, first aid training in Years 3 and 4 and road safety work on local roads in Reception to Years 2. Further Information and Reminders

School Lunches at High Beeches

Our school caterers, HCL, have informed us of their new prices for the 2026/2027 financial year. They are keenly aware of cost of living pressures on working families and work really hard to keep these rises to a minimum, by constantly looking for efficiencies in their purchasing, staffing model and back office functions, whilst maintaining a focus on high quality, sustainable and locally sourced ingredients.

However, this is made particularly challenging by the context of the catering and hospitality industry, which has experienced above-average inflation for food ingredients in recent years and very significant increases in employee costs because of changes in employers' national insurance rates and quite laudable rises in the National Living Wage. In the period from 2015 to 2025, food inflation was over 40% (CPI, ONS) and wage inflation for the company is running at 100% for same time period.

As a result, prices for Junior meals (those in Years 3 to 6) will rise from £3.50 per meal to £3.62 from 13 April 2026. This represents an increase of 3.4%. Any parents who would like to make changes to their child's pattern of school meals should contact the office by 13th March to allow the relevant admin to be actioned.
