

Staying Safe - Alert Regarding Books by Andy Cope

The children's publisher Puffin has issued an alert regarding books authored by Andy Cope including those in the Spy Dogs, Spy Cats, and Spy Pup series.

Within the books, there is a link which encourages children to find out about additional information told during the story. The link is intended to take children to Mr Cope's webpage, however the domain is no longer owned by him and instead the link will direct children to a webpage now owned by a third party. This third party is publishing pornographic content. There is no suggestion that Puffin or Mr Cope are responsible for the pornographic materials, and the content of the actual stories are fine to read,



however if any children access the link with the intent to learn more about the story online they will be exposed to highly inappropriate materials.

Puffin has paused sales, and libraries and retailers have removed these books from their shelves until further notice. We have removed all books from our school library and class book corners. Parents are advised to do the same, if they have copies at home as well as to ensure that parental controls are activated on devices that children use. Highway Code – Expectations for Areas Around Schools

The Highway Code requires drivers to slow down and be vigilant near schools, especially when flashing amber signals or signs are present, and to stop for School Crossing Patrols. You must never park on yellow zig-zag lines or school entrance markings, which are designed to protect children by keeping the area clear for visibility. Additionally, drivers should pass stationary school buses/coaches carefully as children may be getting on or off.



- Drive slowly and cautiously: Be especially aware of children and young cyclists.
- **Flashing amber lights**: If you see a school warning sign with a flashing amber signal, drive very slowly until you are clear of the area, as children may be crossing.
- School Crossing Patrols: You MUST stop if a School Crossing Patrol officer shows a "Stop for children" sign.
- Stationary School Buses/Coaches: Pass stationary school buses/Coaches displaying "School Bus" signs with extreme care.
- Yellow Zig-Zag Markings: Do not stop, wait, or park on yellow zig-zag lines or "School Keep Clear" markings outside schools.
- **Time Plates**: Pay attention to time plates near zig-zag markings, which often indicate busy periods (e.g., 8-9 am and 3-4:30 pm) when children are most likely to be present.
