Dear Parents/Carers

The end of term has arrived and, on behalf of the whole school family, I would like to wish all the children and their families a very peaceful Christmas break. As always, I am immensely grateful to the High Beeches team and our pupils for all their hard work this term, both in terms of their learning and progress and in preparing for and delivering such a high standard of Christmas performances over the course of the last few weeks.

Congratulations to all the children for their various parts in our productions and performances, which ended this week with a joyous Y1 *Songs around the Christmas Tree* – a highly engaging and colourful festival of spoken verse, dance and song and two Key Stage 2 Carol Services at High Street Methodist Church on Wednesday evening.

Thank you to the many parents who have commented positively on the quality of the performances, which not only reflect the hard work of the people involved, but also the culture and character of our school. These are things that are the very essence of High Beeches: collaboratively striving to create something really special. At the carol services, Rev'd John Fellows's Christmas reflection mused on this when he spoke of a recent conversation with a pupil who had referred to the school's USPs (unique selling points) and linked this to that of Christmas itself.

The carol services includes congregational, mainly traditional carols and a variety of more contemporary songs performed as a solo, by year groups, by the whole group and by the choir, with a number of readings telling the Christmas story threaded throughout. The children sang and read beautifully and the readings ended with this.
