Dear Parents/Carers

Having played a few friendly matches in the autumn term, our football team played their first proper matches of the Harpenden Schools Football League on Wednesday this week. On Wednesday this week the children in Key Stage 2 enjoyed an introduction to the Djembe drum, led by Gareth from No. 7 Music when he visited our KS2 Music Assembly. His visit took place prior to his starting a new drumming club (open to pupils in Years 4 to 6) which begins after half-term. This will be a charged for club (direct to No. 7 Music) and will take place on Tuesday lunchtimes, providing the children with the rudiments of drumming and an opportunity to learn more about the different musical elements and performance. Today those in Reception to Year 2 have enjoyed a one-off drama workshop by the people from Perform on the theme of toys. Next week our Year 4 classes will immerse themselves in Roman life in Britain for a day when each class completes its own history workshop day.

### World Book Day – Thursday 5th March 2026

Looking further afield, we are looking forward to celebrating World Book Day in school on Thursday 5 March. This year, in-line with the 'National Year of Reading' - a UK-wide campaign designed to help more people rediscover the joy of reading, our focus is on promoting the idea that reading is fun and can be enjoyed just like any other hobby.

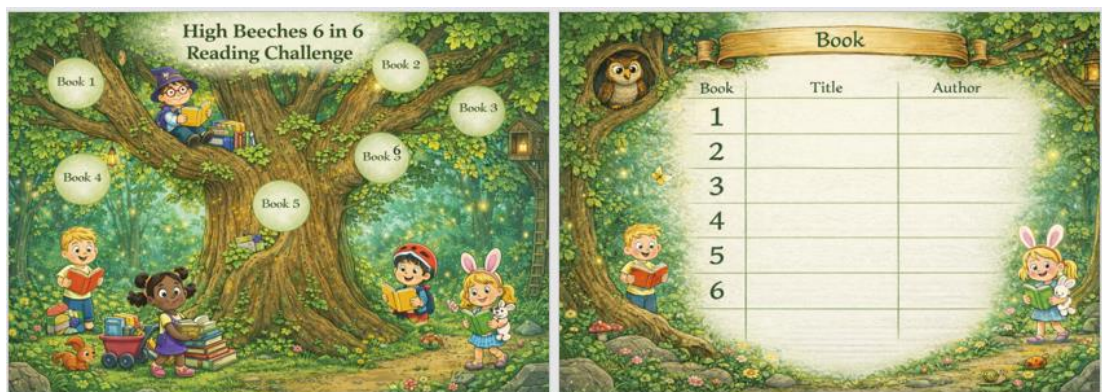
On World Book Day itself, children are invited to come to school dressed as a book character **or** in clothes that reflect their favourite hobby, such as sports kit, dancewear, or just cosy clothes for reading.

In addition to the day itself, we will also be launching our first *High Beeches 6 in 6 Reading Challenge* (which will run from 12<sup>th</sup> February - 26<sup>th</sup> March), encouraging children to read six books for pleasure over six weeks, with stickers and certificates to celebrate their achievements.

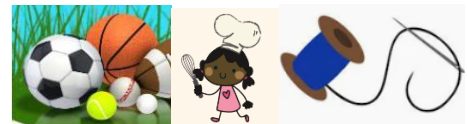
