

Parking

Regrettably, we have had a number of quite concerning complaints from school parents and neighbours about parent parking at drop-off and collection times. These have involved reports of parents parking on the doubleyellow lines on the approach to Willow Court and blocking pavements and driveways in nearby streets. Such parking significantly increases the risk to other road users, including school families who walk home or park further away. Many of our neighbours find this kind of parking very stressful and upsetting and their subsequent complaints negatively impact the reputation of our school.

Family life can be challenging for us as parents and this can sometimes result in our rushing and cutting corners. However, we all have a duty to model the school values of kindness, respect and responsibility to our children through the way we conduct ourselves in public. Please – let's help each other by following these simple dos and don'ts.

DO

- ✓ Allow enough time for the journey and arrive on time
- walk or park and stride, if youcan
- ✓ Usethe carpark at Crabtree
- ✓ If parking on the street, park at least 10m away from a junction

DON'T

- X Park on a pavement
- X Block or obscure an entrance, driveway or junction
- X Park on double-yellow lines at any time.
- X Parkon Zíg-zagsor single yellow lines at the stated times

Further Information and Reminders

Arrangements at the Beginning and End of the School Day

We operate a soft start to the school day with pupils entering between 8:40 and 8:45am (gates lock at 8.45). The children go straight into class. Reception pupils are brought by their parents directly to their external classroom doors. Children in Years 1 to 6 walk into the building independently from the *kiss-and-drop* point by the tree in the front playground. They enter through the double doors at the ends and side of the Meadow Building and to the side of the Orchard Building.

This staggered start helps to ensure there is a calm and swift start to the children's learning activities and that school staff are able to give individualised attention where required. It also helps to reduce congestion on site and in the local area. Parents and children arrive following a one-way system; entering the site via the gate adjacent to the larger bike sheds on the Willow Court side of the site and parents leave via the gate closest to the main building.

The school day ends at 3:10pm for those in Reception and 3:15pm for those in Year 1 upwards. Parents follow the same one-way system in and out of the main school compound, waiting and/or collecting from the door from which their child is dismissed. Children in Reception and Years 1 to 4 are dismissed from their external classroom doors and those in Years 5 and 6 leave via the double doors at either end of the Meadow Building.
