Dear Parents/Carers,

What a busy start we've had to 2026!

Everyone at Ripley Infants has started 2026 with a fantastic work ethic and attitude; meaning that there has been lots of amazing learning taking place. Children have certainly been demonstrating the ASPIRE value – a Passion for Learning and we have loved seeing all the extra things they have been doing at home as well as in class.

After half term we will be marking World Book Day with a Book Week (2nd – 6th March). We also have a Science Week (9th - 13th March) where the children will explore the theme of Curiosity: What is your question? They will also have the chance to take part in a Sublime Science workshop during the school day on Friday 13th March. Please see the relevant information letters for these events.

Importance of punctuality

We would like to emphasise the importance of being in school on time as there have been numerous incidents of some families routinely arriving at 8.50 a.m. or later and collecting their children at 3.20 p.m. or later.

School starts at 8.45 a.m. every day. Children need to be in their class on time so that they can start their lessons promptly. Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused about tasks. It is essential that you ensure that your child arrives at school on time to prevent disruption to your child's own learning and that of others. We are required to monitor children's punctuality and attendance. On-going lateness (after the class register closes) is classified as an unauthorised absence and this is contrary to The Education Act.

We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions please make sure that you contact the school office to inform us when you will arrive. Thank you.

Sporting Success

On Thursday 29th January our Dodgeball team took part in the Amber Valley School Sports Partnership competition at Alfreton Leisure Centre. They played several games, against lots of different schools, and showed skill, determination and great sportsmanship which resulted in them finishing 4th out of 14 schools.
