Spotlight on Learning: A Look Inside Our Classrooms This Term



Willow Class had great fun on Friday afternoon discovering how wheels are attached to an axle and experimented by building a chassis to put these on as part of their **Design & Technology** topic. The next step is for the children to design a wheeled vehicle so they can put their new skills to good use. They have lots of good ideas for their own designs including police cars, Lamborghinis, babies prams and tractors!







Beech Class has been taking part in Voices for Life this year, an experience which takes children on a journey of self discovery through the power of music, creativity and performance. This has involved weekly workshops led by Kate Courage and culminated in two live performances on 13th and 15th November at Wiltshire Music Centre in front of almost 200 people! They performed with such confidence and was definitely a performance to remember. Well done Beech Class, we are very proud of you!





Last week, **Oak Class** visited neighbouring company **Fleet Services GB**, who hosted a Road Safety Week series of workshops to help our children learn more about how to stay safe on the roads!

They walked over a mile to their site, putting the rules of the road we'd learnt into practice, and were greeted by a giant traffic cone and Safety Man, as well as all the other Fleet Services staff dressed in different costumes! They then took part in several activities, including measuring stopping distances at different speeds, crossing the road with some temporary traffic lights set up in the car park, and explored several different vans and lorries, which included helping to 'test' their horns! They very kindly provided the children with hats, goody bags and cupcakes, which had different road signs on top of them! A huge thank you to Fleet Services GB for helping to bring our learning about Road Safety to life; it was a great afternoon and the children loved it!







Music for Minatures Concert Inspires Lacock Primary School!

On **Monday 18**th **November**, each class got to experience **Music for Miniatures**, a group which creates opportunities for children to experience professional classical musicians performing in their community!



The children watched and joined in as the two musicians shared more about their instruments (the trumpet and oboe) in a fun and interactive way,



teaching the children about how their instruments worked, different styles and genres of performance, and even how something as simple as a conch shell could have inspired the world's first musicians thousands of years ago!

Laock Parish Council Petition: Pedestrian Safety Reminder

A message from Lacock Parish Council: "Wilts Council's action has placed School children at increased risk when entering/leaving school walking between parked cars directly onto the highway; emergency evacuation of school via their main gate can no longer be relied on. Pedestrians with mobility issues, wheelchairs, children's buggies etc. can no longer safely access facilities and amenities they need; they are also at increased risk when entering/leaving their residences. There is now also an increased likelihood of vehicles parking close to building accesses obstructing customers and emergency services, obstructing light and increasing pollution into homes.
