We will encourage children to change themselves, by instructing them how to take off and put on clothes and supporting them when they need it.

Our children can access our wonderful outdoor learning environment at all times. When the weather gets colder, children will need a warm coat, gloves, and hat. On wet days, children can wear wellies and even puddle suits.

## Robins

Our topic for Autumn 1 is "Do We Love Where We Live?". Through this theme, the children will learn more about their community and environment, while building curiosity and confidence in talking about the world around them. ### **Emergency alerts test 2025**

The government will be carrying out a national test of the Emergency Alerts system on Sunday 7 September at 15:00. Compatible mobile phones and tablets will receive an alert, make a loud siren-like sound and vibrate for approximately 10 seconds. The Emergency Alerts system is used to warn if there is danger to life nearby, including extreme weather.

For children who are already over 5, it's not too late – our scheme is flexible! As well as being able to register and make payment straight away, you can join and cancel the scheme at any time. We offer yearly, termly and half termly payment periods and a recurring payment option to give you one less thing to remember.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

### How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3 Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- . Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday

### **Need help using Arbor?**


Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or

Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:


- 1. Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor. Ask us to **check the email address** linked to your account.
- Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- 3. If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired . Ask us to send it again.
- 4. Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- 6. Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.



### **Absences**



If you do need to take your child out of school for any reason please can you either show proof of a medical appointment to reception or for a longer absence please fill out a leave of absence form so that we know where they are. It is our legal responsibility to follow up on absences and if we know in advance it saves us from having to contact you.
