Beeches Reads





What was your favourite childhood book and why?


Philip Pullman's *Northern Lights*. The heroine, Lyra, showed me that girls could be just as brave as boys, grown-ups and even armoured polar bears.



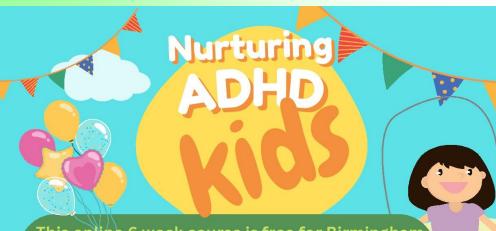

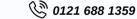
