### SCHOOL NAME AND UNIFORM

Ahead of the amalgamation of our two schools in September 2026, the governors have considered different options for the name of the school and have decided to keep it simple! From 1st September 2026, our school will be known as **Beeches Primary School**. The school jumpers and cardigans from September, from Reception all the way to Year 6, will be the darker "bottle" green colour that the juniors currently wear. This decision was made because it is easier to obtain from a range of suppliers so hopefully, you will have lots of options to purchase uniform at a price that suits your budget. **Please do not worry if your child still fits into their current uniform in September - they can continue to wear the old uniform until it no longer fits.** The finer points of the uniform policy will be looked at in the coming months but it will be largely unchanged. There is one other thing that will need to change, and for that, we need your help...

### SCHOOL BADGE COMPETITION

As our schools combine to become Beeches Primary School, we will need a school badge. Both our schools currently feature a tree on the badge, and we would like the new badge to have at least one tree on it. Here is an example of what a Beech tree looks like - this may help you with your design. You can make your design with coloured pencils, felt pens, paint or any other physical art tools, or alternatively you can use an online programme such as Paint to create your design. Please don't use AI though - we want to see your creativity flourish!



Don't worry if your design doesn't quite seem perfect - we can take your image and work with a design team (and possibly AI) to perfect it to make the finished product. It could even be that the final badge is a combination of two or three children's ideas. One tip: remember that your badge needs to look good on a bottle green jumper!

If your design is used to make our new school badge, you will receive a prize which includes a free school jumper or cardigan, ready for September. The closing date for entries is **Monday 9th February at 8.55am**. Please hand your design to your teacher or one of the school offices, and make sure your name and class are on the back. You can enter as many times as you want.

### UPSET TUMMIES

A reminder that, if your child vomits or has diarrhoea, they must be absent from school for at least 48 hours from their last episode of sickness or diarrhoea. This will help us to limit the spread of bugs. Thank you.

### PARKING AND TRAFFIC

We have been notified of lots of examples of dangerous and inconsiderate driving and parking around our school. We regularly contact the police and the council to raise our concerns. It is particularly upsetting, because **the people who are doing this know that they are putting our children at risk** and they prioritise their own convenience over our children's safety.
