### WORLD CUP EVENTS

To help raise money for our theatre visit in December 2026, we are holding a range of events based around the World Cup.

**Year 2: Toiletries or gift sets.**

All items must be in date and in unopened, sealed packaging.

•Pupils at the infant school will be able to take part in a Penalty Shoot-Out competition against some older pupils in goal on Friday 3rd July. If your child wishes to take part, please send £1 to the Infant school office before Friday 19th June.

•Some junior pupils will take part in a World Cup Football Tournament that will take place at lunchtimes from 18th June onwards. Places for this have now **sold out**. Teams will be drawn on 17th June.

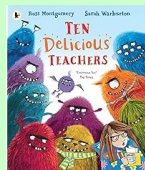

**Did you know that as well as free school meals during term time, your child can also access funded spaces at holiday clubs?**

Through the Department for Education's Holiday Activity and Food Programme, known in Birmingham as Bring it on Brum!, children can attend local holiday clubs packed with fun activities, learning opportunities and healthy meals—all at no cost to you.

If your child is aged 4–16 and eligible for benefits-related free school meals, they're entitled to funded places at Bring it on Brum! holiday clubs.\*

Our clubs offer a wide variety of activities, including sports, arts and crafts, cooking, dance, music, and more—so there's something to suit everyone! Each session also includes a nutritious meal to keep children happy, healthy and energised throughout the day.

Every club runs its own unique programme depending on its location, meaning there's always something new to discover.

Not eligible? Many clubs also offer paid places, so every child can still get involved and enjoy the fun.
