Toys

We have noticed that a number of children have started the term bringing toys to school - mostly Labubu dolls but other things as well, including balls. Please note that children are not permitted to bring toys and games to school. If there is a particular need that your child has that you think means they need to bring a toy to school, please arrange to speak to Mrs Liddington (for pastoral needs) or Mr Ellis (for special educational needs and/or disabilities). In very exceptional circumstances, some items may be permitted - for example, some children bring fidget toys to school with Mr Ellis' agreement - but if you don't have agreement from Mrs Liddington or Mr Ellis, toys must not be brought to school. We thank you for your support with this.

Jewellery And Hair Accessories

We would like to remind you of our uniform policy, particularly the parts about jewellery and hair accessories. Children are permitted to wear one pair of small stud earrings but children must be able to remove them themselves for PE lessons. Loop and dangly earrings are not permitted.

When it comes to hair accessories, modest hair accessories are permitted. Hair bands should be plain black, dark grey, white or green. Multi-coloured hair bands, large ribbons and features such as cats' ears or unicorn horns are not permitted. Modest culturally-significant accessories, such as beads, are permitted as long as they do not present a safety risk or any practical difficulties. Following some recent accidents, claw clips are not permitted.

Our uniform policy was devised in consultation with children and families, and we thank you for your continued support of it.

CHILD

Some time ago, we carried out a consultation with children, staff and families about the values that matter to our school community. Following that, we have put together a vision for the values and attitudes that we want to instil. We are delighted to share with you our "CHILD" initiative. I am writing to inform you of proposals that Birmingham City Council is developing in close collaboration with the leadership and governing bodies of Beeches Infant School and Beeches Junior School (the Schools):

- Discontinue Beeches Infant School;
- Enlarge Beeches Junior School
- Alter the age range of Beeches Junior School to 4 11 year olds
- Implementation 1st September 2026

The Statutory Consultation period ("representation period") will run from 11th September 2025 to 9th October. The council invites all interested people to comment on the proposal during this period.

Curriculum Overview - Here is a summary of the main learning your child will be doing this term:

English: In Reading and Writing, we will begin the term looking at Change Sings by Amanda Gorman before going on to King Midas and the Golden Torch, Pandora's Box and Gender Swapped Greek Myths by Karrie Fransman. In Reading, we will immerse the children in the texts through retrieval practice, making inferences, offering detailed answers supported by the text and exploring the author's intent. In Writing, we will be using figurative language, improving our use of paragraphs, using relative clauses, parenthesis, subordinating and coordinating conjunctions, all whilst writing for a range of audiences.

Computing: We will be using Scratch to create a racing car game, learning how to code and program along the way.

Maths: Throughout this term, we will look at a range of topics such as: place value, calculating with the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), calculating fractions, decimals and percentages, geometry and measurements. We will be developing our use of practical resources to reason and solve problems.

PE: Indoor: Swimming. Outdoor: Netball

Science: 'Marvellous Materials' – Finding out about the properties of materials and their uses and looking at reversible and irreversible changes as well as exploring forces such as gravity, air resistant, levers and pulleys.

Topic (Geography and History): In Autumn 1 we will be learning all about the ancient Greeks. After half term, we will be studying the continent of Europe.

PSHE: This term we are developing **Music:** Building an understanding of pulse, rhythm and pitch whilst singing and playing instruments.

RE: During the first half term we will be learning about Sikhism; after half term we will be studying Christianity.

Art: Sketching and painting linked to Ancient Greece. We will explore water colours and patterns.

Design & Technology: We will be exploring gears and pulleys to create our conversation skills in moving toys.

French: We will be developing different contexts.
