

In our first Eastertide Mission Assembly, we reminded ourselves of the events that lead up to Jesus' death on the cross, the Stations of the Cross, and then celebrated the  $15^{th}$  Station – The Resurrection of Jesus.

We listened to John's Gospel 20:1-18 and heard how Mary Magdalene saw Jesus near the empty tomb but thought he was a gardener. She did not recognise Jesus until he spoke to her and called her name. We prayed:

### A message from the School Council MAD HAIR DAY New Date Friday 26th April

As representatives of the school council, we would like to bring to your attention an issue that has been affecting our learning environments at school. During our recent meetings, we have discussed the need for new blinds in our classrooms as the current ones are no longer functional and are hindering our ability to see our interactive white boards. This makes it difficult for us to follow along and complete our work and has become a daily frustration to us, especially when it is a sunny day. As a school, we strive for excellence, and we believe that it is crucial to achieve our goal to replace the blinds. Y4 have started collecting quotes and so far, we have been quoted between £1000 and £1700 PER



CLASSROOM (and we have at least 6 classrooms in urgent need). We understand that this is a significant amount and that the school budget will not stretch this far so we have decided to take matters into our own hands and raise funds for the blinds ourselves.

Our first fundraising day is a MAD HAIR DAY on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April. We are asking for a minimum of £2 per pupil for this, however we understand that these are challenging times therefore any contribution would be highly appreciated.

### Gates opening early for Y6 only

Please can we remind Y6 parents that the gates open at <u>8.30am</u>, <u>for Y6 early entry</u>. However, there have been some Y6 children arriving much too early, which is concerning as they are left unsupervised outside.

### Afterschool Sport Activities

Next week all sporting activities will be starting. If you were able to consent and make payment this means that your child has a confirmed place. All activities should be done in the correct uniforms not school PE kit. If your child has an outdoor activity the clothing should be suitable for outdoor activities. No snacks needed.













### Administering medication

This week we have had a numerous medication being brought into school in children's bags. Please can I remind you that all medication should be given in to the school office and a form needs to be completed. Staff can only administer the medication if it has been prescribed by a GP and the medication is lablled with the NHS label advising of when the medication is to be given and dose. NO medication should be given to a child to give to the class teacher themselves.

### Merit Assemblies/Data Collection

Please can I remind you all that our merit assessmbly times are 2.30pm. This is for both KS1 & KS2. You will receive a message on Wednesday evening if your child has received the merit. In order for us to be able to invite you, we need your most up-to-date contact details. Please check your Sims parent lite data and ensure that your details are up-to-date so you don't miss out. If you have any other updates please can this be updated via the app.

### Recording Absence

It has come to our attention that when the office are receiving messages for children being absent, parents are leaving a short message that their child is going to be absent without specifying the actually illness. Please remember to give exact reason as this needs to be recorded correctly. All calls for absence must be made **before 9.00am**. If the office have not been notified of your childs absence, you will receive a text message from school and if no reply then calls will be made. Our policy is that if your child has been physically sick, they must stay off for 48 hours.

### Medical Appointments

May we please ask that, where possible, medical appointments are made outside of school hours. The office staff will request evidence of any medical appointments which is in accordance with our attendance policy. Evidence should be emailed into admin prior to the appointment. If evidence is not provided the session missed will be marked as unauthorised. Thank you for your cooperation.

### <u>Lateness</u>

This week we have had quite a few children being dropped off to school late. Please give yourself enough time in the morning, as your child coming into school late causes upset to them and they miss valuable learning time.
















# How could you and your family benefit from family support?

The Supporting Families programme is designed to help your family in the difficult moments of your life. Our team of practitioners are skilled professionals and want to help your family be the best that you can be. The earlier you get help the better.

### What happens if I don't want the help?

You do not have to take the support that we are offering you, this is a voluntary programme and you can tell us at any time if you no longer want the support. We aim to help you get to a successful outcome within 16 weeks.

### How do I get support?

If you want to receive early help from the team, please speak to someone from your child's school, your health visitor; pre-school or nursery; or any service that is working with your family.

If you are not currently working with anyone, you can request help by visiting your local Family Hub or visit www.coventry.gov.uk/ applyearlyhelp or call 0800 8870545. All help is free and confidential.

### Who will help?

Your family will be allocated a Supporting Families practitioner, who will work with you to find the help and support you need and bring a team of professionals that can work with your family.

### How we will work with you

The help offered to each family depends on your needs. The Supporting Families practitioner will help each family to develop your own support plan. They will find out what matters to you and what you want to change. We will do this by gathering information about your family (an assessment) which will inform the plan. We will review this plan regularly with you. Your Supporting Families practitioner will be your single point of contact and they will co-ordinate your family plan and the team around your family.

### How do we offer Family Support?

Family support is delivered through a 16 week intensive package of support. We will work with you to understand what help you need and make a plan that may include working with members of your family, friends and other professionals so that you can make positive changes.

# We have teams of Supporting Families practitioners ready to help children, young people and their families

We can help with the following situations:

- Education we can help children and young people access good education that meets their needs.
- Early Years development we can help children have good early years development and the best start in life.
- Mental and physical health we can help families be healthy and emotionally well.
- Substance misuse we can help your family be safe from the impact of substance abuse.
- Family relationships we can help your family to thrive and support your relationships to be positive.
- Children and young people identified as being at risk of abuse and exploitation - we can help ensure children and young people are safe and protected from abuse and exploitation.
- Crime prevention and tackling crime we can help your family be safe and protected from the impact of crime.
- Domestic abuse we can help your family be safe from the impact of domestic abuse.
- Secure housing we can help you to live in secure and suitable housing.
- + Financial stability we can help your family be financially resilient.

To get help from the **Supporting Families Team** you will need to have three or more of the issues listed. We can also help you access the right help if you have one or two issues facing you now.

### How will my information be shared?

You will be asked for your agreement for Early Help services to come together to support you and your family and to share relevant information to get the right help with the right people.

We will use your personal information so that we can provide the right advice and guidance and provide the help that you require as early as possible. We process personal data because it is necessary to comply with our legal obligations and perform our public duty. We will only share information when it is necessary and lawfully. We will tell you if we need to do this and who we are sharing information with.

Coventry City Council complies with the Data Protection Act and the GDPR and is registered with the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) as a Data Controller.


