Year 5- Emma Carroll. Year 6- Philip Pullman




During October, a selection of books will be available in class libraries and on the central display in the school library to help us celebrate


Black History Month. Once October is finished, these books

What topic-related books have you loved? We have a fantastic selection of non-fiction books linked to your topics in your classrooms.


Have you shared your love of reading with others?

Mrs Wilcox's favourite children's book is 'The Twits' by Roald Dahl.


