
Her commitment and passion to learn independently and striving for excellence in her artwork is truly inspiring.

Carlotta: Congratulations to Carlotta, who was awarded a certificate for successfully completing the Marie Curie Swimathon 400m challenge in 00:10:15!




4 - Year 4: River and Mountain




















The Kindness Cup


