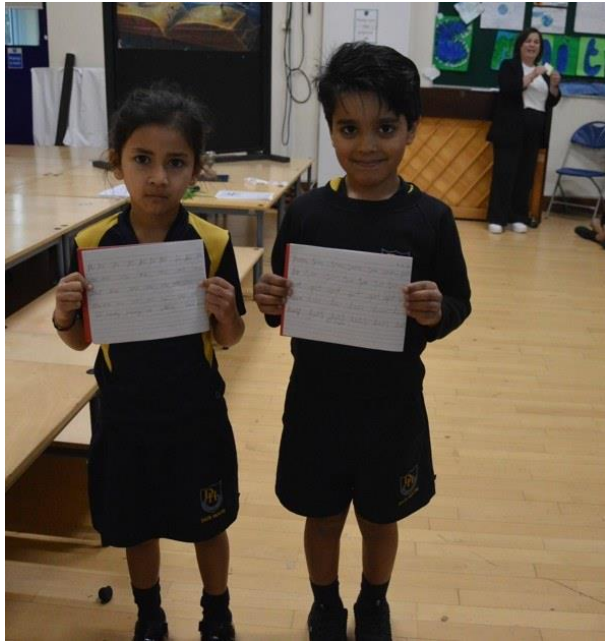
## Our Talented Children

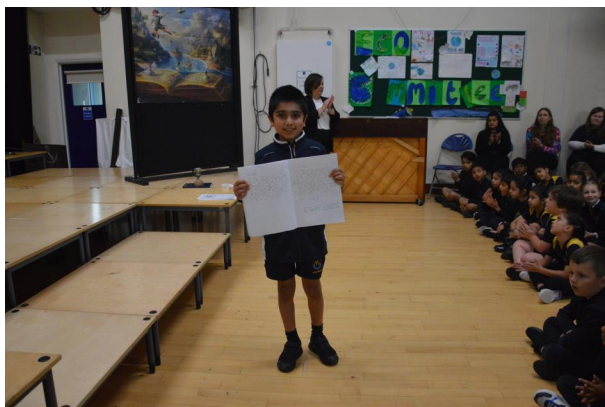

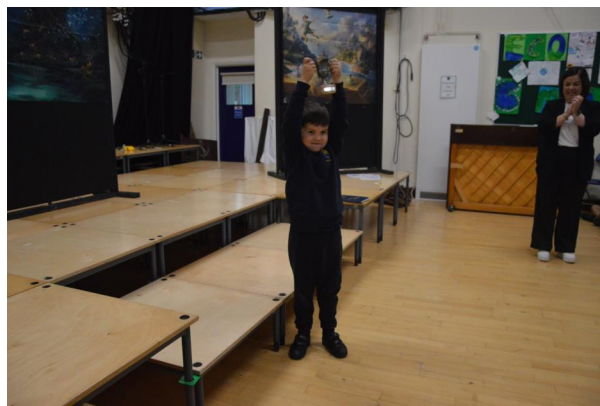




## Kindness Cup

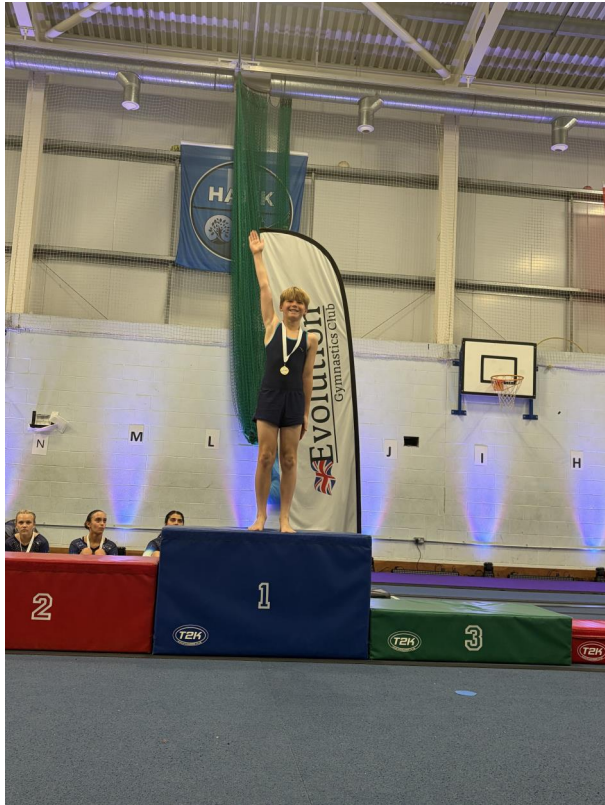
A special congratulations goes to our individual award winners:

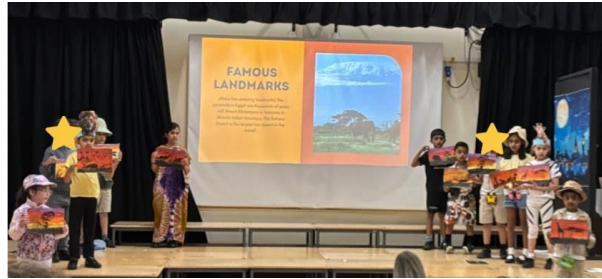

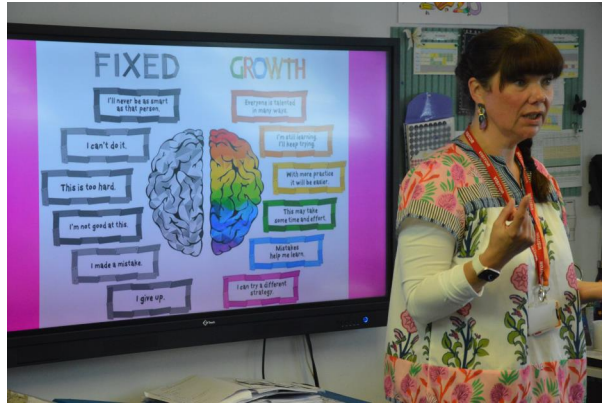




## BRIYM - Building Resilience in Young Minds

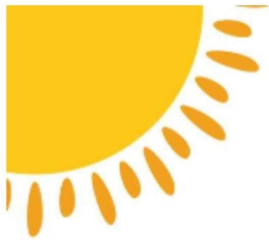

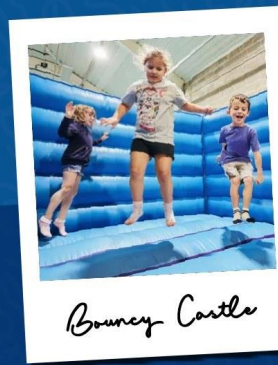

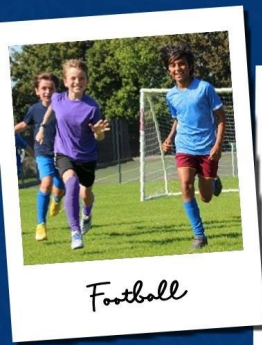
