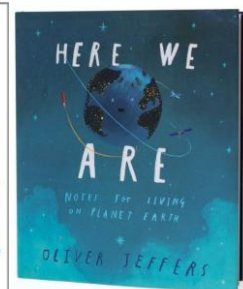
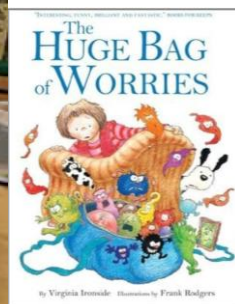


Well done to Green team for winning this half term's House Cup. They have chosen to wear their own clothes on the first Friday back to school.
