Census Day

On Thursday 15th January, it is our Census Day. When we have a census it means that we give our school information to the Department for Education e.g. How many pupils we have. Part of the information we give is about school meals. The more children we have taking a school meal on Thursday 15th January, the more money the school receives. This will mean more TAs, more visitors, more opportunities. We had a drop in the take up of school meals in October by 25% this means 25% less funding in an area of the school. I understand that some children may never have a school dinner, but it really impacts the work we are trying to do in school.
