## October 2025

During the month of October, we would like you to remember in your prayers that this is the month of **The Holy Rosary**.

The word Rosary means 'Crown of Roses' Our Lady has revealed to several people that each time they say a Hail Mary they are giving her a beautiful rose and that each complete Rosary makes her a crown of roses. The rose is the queen of flowers, and so the Rosary is the rose of all devotions and it is therefore the most important one. The Holy Rosary is considered a perfect prayer because within it lies the awesome story of our salvation. With the Rosary we meditate the mysteries of joy, of sorrow and the glory of Jesus and Mary. It's a simple prayer, humble so much like Mary. It's a prayer we can all say together with Her, the Mother of God.



#### Curiosity

This month our gospel value will be curiosity. Curiosity means wanting to learn more about the world God has made. It's about asking questions, looking closely, and discovering new things. When we are curious, we are saying, "God, your world is amazing, and I want to understand it better!"

I will ask good questions to help me learn more.

I will listen carefully when someone explains something new.

Homework: This month, show your curiosity by choosing one of these activities:

- Ask and Discover Think of a question about the world (e.g., "Why do stars shine?" or "How do bees make honey?"). Ask an adult or look in a book to find out the answer. Write or draw what you discovered.
- Nature Detective Go outside and look closely at something in nature (a leaf, a bug, the sky, a flower). Draw a picture of it and write one thing you noticed.
