Education Sunday

Catholic Education Sunday in England and Wales will be observed on Sunday, September 14, 2025. This annual day celebrates Catholic education and gives thanks for those who work in Catholic schools, colleges, and universities, coinciding with the start of the academic year. The theme for 2025 is "The Son of Man must be lifted up," taken from St. John's Gospel, and aligns with the Holy Year of Jubilee theme of "Pilgrims of Hope".

<u>Uniform</u>

Please ensure all children have the correct uniform which is clearly labelled with the child's full name with the special clothes stickers, labels or laundry pen. Please do not use initials only or a normal pen as this is not sufficient. Please ensure your child also has their correct school PE kit I must emphasise that PE is a compulsory part of the curriculum and a child may only be excused with a written note for medical reasons. Long hair for girls should be tied back. **No jewellery** is allowed in school, other than small stud earrings and a watch. Any child found wearing hooped earrings/necklaces/bracelets or other items of jewellery will be asked to remove them and place the items in a sealed envelope. The Parent/Carer will be contacted and requested to collect the jewellery from the school office. This is a Health and Safety regulation.

Non-Smart Mobile phones

No smartphones are allowed at school. A non-smart basic phone may be brought to school and this needs to be handed in to the school office every morning. Thank you to all the parents who have supported us with this.

Breakfast club

This club will run from 7.30am and the cost is £3.00 per session. All payments must be made via **ParentPay** in advance.

DfE Early Adopters Breakfast Scheme

This provision will run daily from <u>8.00am</u> in the school hall. Any child in the school from Reception to Year 6 can access this service for free. <u>Please do not come in before this time or you will be charged for breakfast</u>.

Kidzone

The hours for Kidzone are from 3.20pm – 6.00pm. All payments must be made in advance through ParentPay. The cost of this provision is £6 per hour. The cost from 3.20-6.00 will be £16.

If you are collecting late, you will be charged for the full hour. Please respect the collection times.

We will let you know if there are any new clubs starting.

Holidays during school time are not permitted.

The school is closed for 14 weeks of the year and families are expected to use this time for taking holidays and visiting family. If you have an exceptional circumstance requiring leave during term time, you must complete a leave of absence form (available from the School Office). You will then be invited to a meeting at the school with the Deputy Headteacher to discuss the matter. The final decision will be made by the Headteacher. Parents should not under any circumstances make travel arrangements during term time without discussing it with the school first.

Please check out the calendar on the jotter for dates and times of events.

Children taken out of school for unauthorised leave during term time will be issued with an Education Penalty Notice. The Education Welfare Service may issue a parent with a Notice to Improve, an Education Penalty Notice (EPN) or decide to prosecute if a child is persistently absent over a minimum period of 10 weeks. If a parent is issued with an EPN, they risk receiving a fine from Brent Council of £160 if paid within 28 days. This is reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days. Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period being charged at a higher rate of £160 with no option for this second offence to be discharged at the lower rate of £80. Fines for unauthorised term time leave are issued to each parent for each absent child. Failure to pay the notice may result in a parent being prosecuted in court for their child's unauthorised absence.
