- **Mary Lee R.I.P.** Mary passed away peacefully in her home following a long illness borne with dignity. Mary has been a stalwart member of English Martyrs parish and St Margaret Clitherow school communities for fifty years.

Mary led the Music Group in the parish for many years. She was also a reader at Sunday mass until her eyesight started to deteriorate. The Easter Triduum was her favourite part of the liturgical year. She would spend hours preparing the music for the weekend celebrations. One of Mary's favourite readings is from the Book of Genesis. It is the first Reading at the Easter Vigil read by Mary for many years in her usual meticulous voice. Over the years Mary supported many charities here in the parish and overseas. Her generosity knew no bounds. She made a difference to so many people's lives.

Almost fifty years ago Mary volunteered to clerk for the governing body at St Margaret Clitherow School until a permanent one could be appointed. She then became a Foundation Governor appointed by the Archbishop. Like everything Mary took on she excelled by her commitment to the welfare of the children and staff. Mary was an avid reader and enjoyed going into school on a weekly basis to listen to the children read. She provided many books for the school library. Mary attended the class assemblies regularly in fact one of her last outings was to a concert at the school.

Mary will be sorely missed by her many friends. May her gentle soul rest in peace.
