### Early Years Foundation Stage 1 Newsletter

This term the children have been learning Nursery's Golden Rules of 'sharing, having kind hands, working together, walking feet inside, washing our hands before eating and after using the toilet and careful climbing in the Nursery garden'.







The children went to the wooded area and listened to the stories: We're going on a Bear Hunt and Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We re-enacted the Bear Hunt story pretending the path was mud, the tyres were the river, the wooded area was the forest. We found a teddy bear hiding in a tree.















The children have been learning about size, measuring, counting and numerals 1,2, and 3. They loved role playing Goldilocks and the Three Bears in the enhanced provision.







The children walked through Reception and Year One sensibly and had lots of fun singing action rhymes in the KS1 hall.





A special little baby, Joel, came to visit and play with the children. We discussed how we have changed since we were babies, our differences and similarities and how we are all unique. Each child painted a self-portrait which will be displayed in Nursery alongside their baby photographs.









The children have been learning about their senses. They tasted, smelled and touched porridge, honey, strawberries, sugar, coffee, onions and enjoyed singing about their five senses.

On our autumn walk we collected fallen leaves.

### Year RCM Autumn 1 Newsletter.



We have had a great start to our Reception year. We have settled in and learnt all the routines so quickly. We are already growing in confidence and love to talk and share our ideas when on the carpet.

We have started our daily phonics sessions and are working so hard to learn the 26 single letter sounds. Some of us are even starting to blend simple CVC words which is amazing! We are working hard on our writing, and we practise writing our name every morning when we come in school. It would really help if we keep practising our sounds, blending and writing letters at home too.

#### Mathematical Development

We love our Maths sessions, and we started the year by working on creating different patterns. We then started our number work and have been learning all about the numbers 1,2 and 3. We have been making groups of these numbers using objects around the classroom. We have also been working on our subitising (saying how many without counting). We have learnt to count the number in our heads whilst listening to musical instruments. We have looked at different arrangements of the numbers and talked about how we see it.









#### Personal, Emotional and Social Development

We have enjoyed making so many new friends since starting Reception. We have talked about what we need to do to be a good friend. We enjoyed a special painting activity where we chose two primary colours with a friend and then mixed them together to make a different colour and some special friendship handprints.







We have really enjoyed the start of our PATHS journey in reception. We have loved meeting the different characters and talking about out feelings. One of our favourite parts of the day is choosing who is going to be 'Pupil of the Day'. We all love giving compliments to make that person feel very special.









We have had such a great first half term and our teachers are so proud of us! We are now ready for a nice week of resting before we come back for lots more learning and fun leading up to Christmas!

#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

At the start of this half term, we focused on ourselves. During circle time, we talked about how we are different from our friends, but how this makes us all special and unique. We talked about our body and how to keep healthy and we carefully drew our own figure drawings, ensuring we added the correct number of body parts. We looked in the mirror and recognised what colour our hair and eyes are before painting our own self portraits. We have also been learning about families. We talked about how all families are different and using the family photographs sent into school, we have enjoyed listening to the children tell us about who lives in their house.







#### Understanding of the World - People and Communities

As part of understanding the world around us, we have been talking about where we live. We enjoyed our music lessons.






In our PATHS lessons we have been learning how to 'Do Turtle' to stay calm when we are excited or frustrated.

#### **English**

#### Spanish Day



## We have had a full and fabulous half term in Y2C









#### Computing

In computing, Year 2 learnt to code using 2Go on Purple Mash. The children built simple algorithms and a set of instructions to move a character along a range of routes. They needed to consider the directions taken and the distances covered to create successful commands. Once they had practised and started to build their coding skills, they moved on to using the direction keys and number counters to move onto making two step coding instructions.





#### Music

This term, the children took part in a range of musical activities delivered by the St Helens Music Service. They learnt about music having a 'pulse' and how it is made up of long and short and high and low sounds, called 'rhythm' and 'pitch'. The children thoroughly enjoyed playing a selection of notes: C, D, E, F, G, A on the glockenspiels. They were also improvising and composing music using body percussion and chair drumming. The story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff was brought to life by the children's musical accompaniment including writing simple symbols in their musical notations.






## Pupil Power Assembly

## What a great start to the year we have had in Y2F!



We have had a great start to our English lessons this year and are really showing our teachers what great writers we are. We listened to the story 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne and did not expect the characters to become best friends in the end. We then used the ideas from this book to write our own stories.




# Year 3W - Autumn 1






## Y5B Autumn 1 Newsletter








Y5B have been busy investigating materials and their properties through a variety of exciting experiments. Their curiosity and enthusiasm have truly shone through - science has never been so fun!



We've been super scientists! There have been many different experiments we have taken part in whilst learning about materials and their properties.








In PE, we have focused on 'Invasion Games'. We worked hard on attacking, defending and trying new skills.






We have worked on place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication in Maths.

We all enjoyed taking part in our school's Spanish day celebration as part of the National European Day of Languages.







The children have had an amazing start to Y6! They have worked extremely hard and we are very proud of them. Take a look at just some of the exciting things we have been learning about!











We have enjoyed an energetic half term of past-paced invasion games in **PE**! The children displayed great enthusiasm and sportsmanship.


During our **art** lessons we studied **Georgia O'Keeffe**, allowing us the opportunity to 'take time to look'.

## Autumn 1




#### **Mathematics**
