Through age-appropriate discussions and activities, pupils explored themes of kindness, tolerance and respect, helping them to understand the importance of remembering the past and standing up against prejudice and discrimination.


Year 5 Assembly – Holi



Safeguarding

In class ready to learn by ...



Artificial intelligence (AI) is now a common part of children's online lives, from learning tools used in school to games and entertainment apps. This **#WakeUpWednesday** guide explains what AI is in a clear and simple way, helping adults talk to children about it without making it seem more powerful or trustworthy than it really is. It looks at how AI works, where children might come across it online, and why it is important to understand it.

The guide also explains key online safety issues, such as false information, sharing personal data, bias and becoming too reliant on AI tools. It offers practical advice on setting boundaries, choosing age-appropriate apps and encouraging children to use AI safely, responsibly and creatively, while developing good digital skills.
