Year 6 Transition

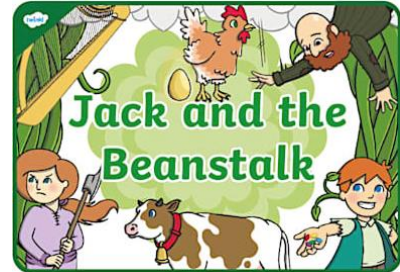

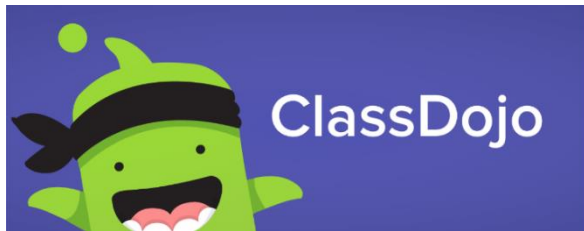
