Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy and inspiring week here at school, filled with learning, creativity, and important conversations. The children have shown great enthusiasm and maturity as they took part in a range of enriching experiences both in and outside the classroom.

Anti-Bullying Week

This week, our whole school community came together to mark Anti-Bullying Week, focusing on the theme “*The Power of Good*.” Throughout the week, pupils engaged in an assembly, discussions and activities that helped them understand the importance of kindness, empathy, and standing up for others. It was wonderful to see how confidently the children shared their ideas about what it means to be a good friend and how to create a safe, respectful school environment for everyone.



KS2 Anti-Racism Assembly and Workshops

On Wednesday, children in Key Stage 2 attended a special Anti-Racism Assembly, where they explored the meaning of respect, equality, and fairness. The assembly encouraged pupils to think about how their words and actions can have an impact on others, and how they can actively promote inclusion. Following the assembly, classes took part in workshops which gave children the opportunity to discuss real-life scenarios, reflect on the importance of celebrating diversity, and think about how they can challenge discrimination in positive, age-appropriate ways. We were so proud of how thoughtfully and respectfully the children engaged with these important topics.

Year 1 and Year 2 Visit to Wembley Library

Also on Wednesday, our Year 1 and Year 2 pupils enjoyed a fantastic trip to Wembley Library, where they were treated to a lively performance of *The Big Bug Show*. The children were captivated by the storytelling, songs, and drama, and it was lovely to see their faces light up as they joined in with the fun. The visit also helped to inspire their love of reading and storytelling — we hope many will be inspired to visit their local library again soon!

Film Festival Visits

Our participation in the Into Film Festival continued this week, offering pupils the chance to experience the magic of cinema and learn through film.

- On Thursday, Year 4 visited Vue Cinema, as part of the national celebration of film and storytelling.
- On Friday, Year 3 headed to Cineworld to take part in the same festival. The children thoroughly enjoyed the experience, and it provided rich opportunities for discussion back in class — from story structure and character development to the power of visual storytelling.
